CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

The Neurology for the Non-Neurologist conference offers the most up-to-date information regarding the treatment of neurologic problems in the primary care setting. This conference focuses on how to diagnose and treat common neurological disorders, order and interpret appropriate diagnostic studies, and provides a guide for therapy and appropriate patient care.

Primary care physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurses, and other medical professionals with an interest in neurology are invited to attend.

OBJECTIVES

1. Identify common headache conditions and determine appropriate workup and treatment options.
2. Determine diagnostic criteria for neuro-infectious disorders in the primary care setting.
3. Recognize common presentations of MS and when to refer to neurology.
4. Discuss important issues in caring for persons with opioid addiction and neurological conditions.
5. Summarize the important components of caring for the patient with dementia.
6. Evaluate patients with dizziness.
7. Discuss the updated guidelines for the management of patients with epilepsy.
8. Demonstrate an understanding of the focused neurological exam.
