The Tarrant County Infant Health Network is currently accepting abstracts for poster presentations during the *2017 Infant Health Summit* in one or more of the following subject categories:

- ☐ Health equity
- ☐ Infant mortality and morbidity
- ☐ Environmental health
- ☐ Infant mental health
- ☐ Adolescent health, sexuality, and pregnancy prevention
- ☐ Fatherhood involvement
- ☐ Preconception and interconception health
- ☐ Family planning
- ☐ Prematurity/preterm birth/birth weight
- ☐ Birth defects
- ☐ Life course perspective and its impact on pregnancy outcomes
- ☐ Health care systems
- ☐ Other (specify)

Abstracts should not exceed 500 words and should be submitted in one of the following two formats - **Format I: Data Focus** or **Format II: Program/Policy Focus**.

- ☐ **Format I: Data Focus.** Most appropriate for the presentation of scientific research, study findings, data analyses, or evaluation outcomes. Suggested components to include in your abstract are
 - **Title:** Title of project, location, major contributors
 - **Background:** Description of the problem, program evaluated, significance.
 - **Objectives:** Study objectives, the hypothesis to be tested.
 - **Methods:** Study design, analytic methods, approach taken.
 - **Results:** Specific results in summary form (with appropriate statistical analyses).
 - **Limitations:** Limitations of research / study / evaluation findings.
 - **Conclusions/Implications:** Discussion, implications (particularly for prevention programs or evaluations), conclusions.

❑ **Format II: Program/Policy Focus.** Most appropriate for description of programs or other activities affecting infant and/or family health including descriptions of community-based programs, discussions of maternal/child health policy or ethics, and models for program evaluation, dissemination and capacity development. Suggested components to include in your abstract are

- **Title:** Title of project, location, major contributors
- **Issue:** Identify the specific problems, needs addressed, or purpose.
- **Setting:** Geographic location, description of where program / activities took place, and intended clients / audience.
- **Project:** Description of the program or model / activities, approach developed/ implemented.
- **Accomplishments/Results:** Specific qualitative / quantifiable results or activities in summary form, major accomplishments.
- **Barriers:** Summary of specific barriers encountered and how / whether they were overcome.
- **Lessons Learned:** Summary of the lessons learned and implications (particularly for prevention programs).

Those interested in presenting at the *2017 Infant Health Summit* should submit by e-mail before 5:00pm CDT on Friday August 25, 2017 **both** of the following:

- The Abstract Submission Form
- An abstract of poster presentation in one of the suggested formats: Data Focus or Program/Policy Focus
