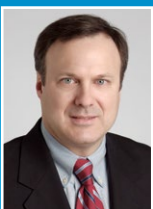

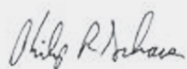
In addition to compelling general sessions, the 2017 MISS will offer hands-on training with optional workshops in laparoscopic suturing and flexible endoscopy.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

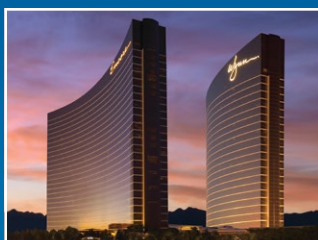
