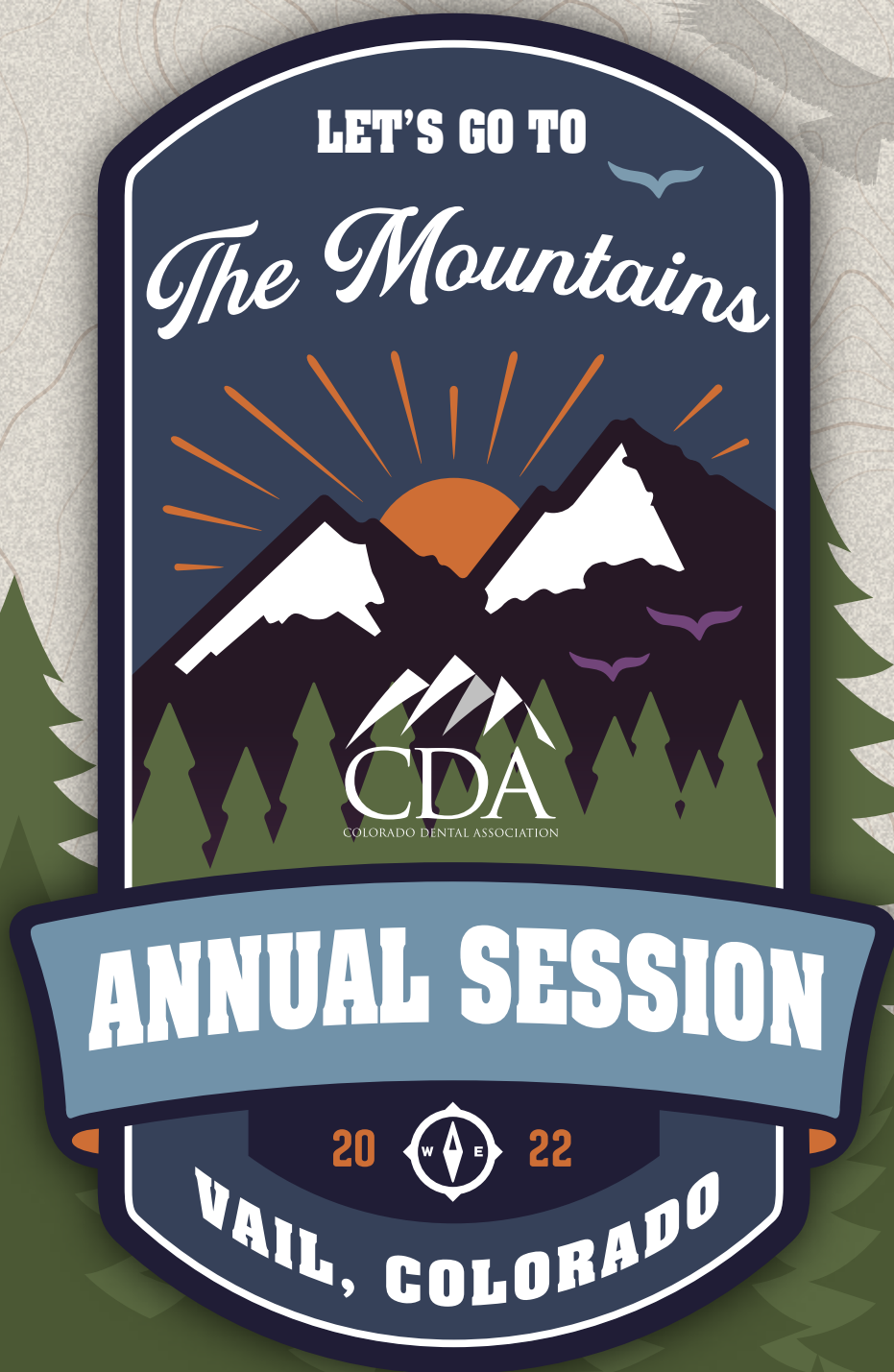

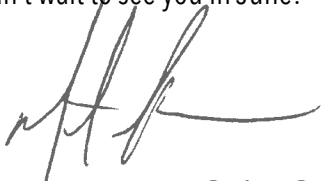

To Pull or Not to Pull & The Single Tooth Implant: Alternative Treatment Approaches for Compromised Teeth, Implants and Patients

Course Synopsis:

What alternative treatment options should be considered when a restorative and/or endodontic failure occurs? Advancements in delivering multiple oral surgical and periodontal approaches have resulted in success rates that can be equivalent to implant replacement when certain guidelines are adhered to. That periapical surgery is an adjunct to endodontic treatment and is a proven approach with much higher success rates than originally thought when a new approach is utilized. With the introduction of new surgical techniques and a systematic method for the diagnosis and treatment of compromised teeth, the clinician should be able to determine the long-term prognosis more accurately for these treatment options.

This course will describe the indications and contraindications for performing these treatment options. A decision can then be more accurately made as to whether an implant or multiple implants or a fixed bridge (fixed partial prosthesis), a removable prosthesis (fixed or transitional temporary prosthesis), or other options would be the final treatment option.

Learning Objectives:

- Gain information about which radiographic, CBCT and clinical approach to use when evaluating a tooth for a fracture.
- Understand Socket Shield Technique (partial root extraction) and when and where it can be utilized.
- Learn about the use of guided tissue regeneration for poor prognosis cases and the indications and contraindications for its use.
- Recognize that the location of a sinus tract can be a key critical diagnostic indicator for a final prognosis.
- Identify how to differentiate between endo/periodontal vs. periodontal/endo lesions and understand the difference as this relates to the final prognosis.

- Understand how new implants can help older implants from failing.
- Know when and where it's a high risk vs. a low-risk option to place dental implants.



About the Speaker: Dr. Daniel Pompa is a fellow of The American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons and is also a fellow of The International Congress of Oral Implantologists. Dr. Pompa has been a guest lecturer at Columbia University College of Dental Medicine, New

York University College of Dentistry and the University of Florida College of Dentistry. He has lectured extensively both nationally and internationally, and in 2013 became a Seminar Series Speaker/Consultant for the ADA. Dr. Pompa is an author and has been featured in JADA, the NYSAGD Journal and Dentistry Today where he was listed as a "Leader in Continuing Education." He is an inventor and has been issued a U.S. patent for his innovative work in the field of dental implantology.

Oral Pathology: What to Look For, How to Recognize It and What to Do When You Find It

Course Synopsis:

This course will provide a fundamental overview of oral pathology lesions and diseases that the general dental practitioner must know for the competent care of patients. Normal variants and common oral lesions encountered in each specific location of the oral cavity will be described along with appropriate treatment of these lesions. The course will also focus on the diagnosis and management of oral mucosal diseases ranging from recurrent oral aphthous, herpetic ulcers to candidiasis to the autoimmune conditions classified under the clinical diagnosis of desquamative gingivitis, which include lichen planus, mucous membrane pemphigoid, erythema multiforme and the life-threatening pemphigus vulgaris.



CE Seminars

Learning Objectives:

- Understand the steps of a comprehensive extra-oral and intra-oral exam and recognize normal structures and variants of normal.
- Identify common oral lesions found in each specific site of the oral cavity and describe their management.
- Diagnose oral mucosal diseases including oral ulcers, candidiasis, and autoimmune conditions that fall under the category of desquamative gingivitis.
- Describe treatment options for oral mucosal diseases and recognize the conditions that require referral to an oral pathologist or oral medicine specialist.



About the Speaker: Dr. Sonal Shah is a board-certified oral and maxillofacial pathologist with extensive clinical, teaching and surgical pathology experience. She is currently an associate professor of oral pathology at the University of Nevada Las Vegas and private practitioner

in the Faculty Practice. She previously maintained a clinical oral pathology private practice in NYC and was also an assistant professor at NYU College of Dentistry, where she was appointed director of the NYU Oral Medicine Clinic. She is a seasoned speaker and has presented at the ADA, the Greater NY Dental Meeting, the AAOMP and numerous hospitals and dental societies.

Lesion Sterilization and Tissue Repair (LSTR)

Course Synopsis:

This course aims to inform dental practitioners of an emerging alternative treatment to pulpectomies and extractions for non-vital primary teeth called lesion sterilization and tissue repair (LSTR). LSTR is a non-instrumentation endodontic treatment that involves a tri-antibiotic mixture in a propylene glycol vehicle, which is used to disinfect root canal systems. The procedure will be reviewed in detail and

our personal clinical outcomes will be presented. Additionally, we will provide a synopsis of the development of this technique including the bacteriologic nature of the clinical abscess, difficulties with space maintenance with extractions, and a literature review of the current evidence supporting the application of LSTR in clinical practice.

Learning Objectives:

- Understand the origins of the development of the Lesion Sterilization and Tissue Repair (LSTR) technique.
- Learn about the foundational research on which the LSTR technique is based.
- Recognize the selection criteria for application of the LSTR technique.
- Identify the LSTR technique to treat infected primary teeth.



About the Speaker: Dr. Brian Hodgson received his dental degree from Marquette University in 1987 and a Certificate in Pediatric Dentistry from Children's Hospital of Wisconsin in 1993. He became board certified by the American Board of

Pediatric Dentistry in 2001 and served on the Oral Clinical Examination Committee for the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry until his appointment to the Board of Directors of the ABPD in May 2021. Dr. Hodgson has been an instructor in the Pediatric Dentistry Residency Program at Children's Hospital of Wisconsin since July 1993 and joined the faculty at Marquette University School of Dentistry in March 2003. His clinical research has been focused on the prevention and treatment of cancer therapy-related oral mucositis, but also investigates oral health-related findings in patients with SHCN.
