PRECONFERENCE D (1:15 - 5:30 P.M.) TAKING YOUR IUD SKILLS TO THE NEXT LEVEL

This session provides advanced, evidence based guidance for the clinical management of IUD patients. This is designed as a stand-alone session for experienced clinicians already performing IUD placements or as "part 2" for participants in the morning practicum session. Discussion begins with patient-centered IUD counseling tips and nuances of informed consent. Following this, successful strategies for dealing with difficult IUD placements will be presented. These include placements in obese patients, patients with fibroids, and traversing the challenging internal os. Pain prevention and management during outpatient procedures, responding to IUD complaints and side effects, and prevention and management of IUD complications will be discussed in detail. An interactive discussion regarding efficient practices for same-day IUD placement, as well as case studies in coding and reimbursement, will close the session.

Anita L. Nelson, MD

Since the introduction of the original, very high dose birth control pills, clinical trials (and product labeling) have reported adverse events that occurred to women while they were using the hormonal contraceptive being studied. Over time, women have come to expect that a wide range of problems may plague them when they use those hormonal methods. These expectations have made women reluctant to use these contraceptives and if they do try them, to discontinue their use. In this series of talks we will first explore the available evidence to determine which of all these completes women present with are attributable to the hormones. Then, method by method, in a case-based approach, we will explore how to minimize and/or treat the complaints women do have.

- ▶ List risks and side effects attributable to the estrogens and progestins used in hormonal contraception based on evidence.
- ▶ Describe how to counsel women about other side effects commonly attributed to hormonal contraception.
