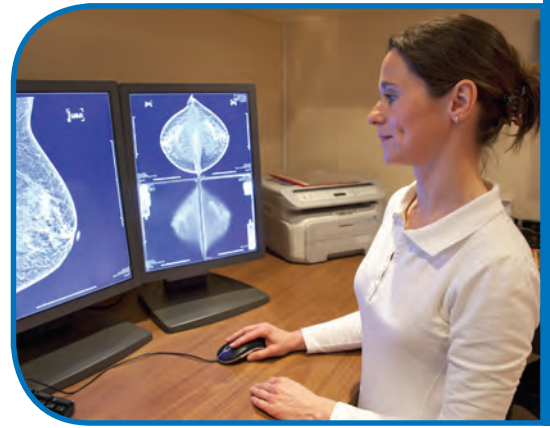
FORMAT

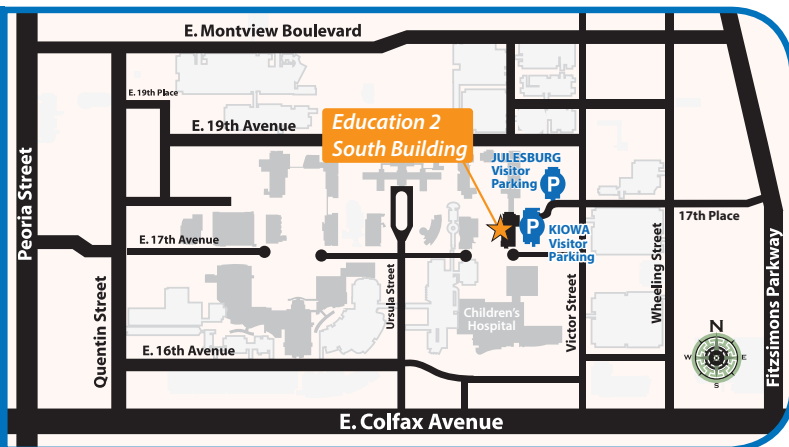
LEARNING OBJECTIVES
