Keynote Speaker

Jody Hoffer Gittell, PhD



Jody Hoffer Gittell, PhD, is a professor at Brandeis University's Heller School for Social Policy and Management and an expert on relational coordination and organizational performance. She founded the Relational Coordination Research Collaborative and serves as its executive director. She co-founded a university spinoff called Relational Coordination Analytics and serves as its chief scientific officer.

*Gittell has written *The Southwest Airlines Way: Using the Power of Relationships to Achieve High Performance*; *High Performance Healthcare: Using the Power of Relationships to Achieve Quality, Efficiency and Resilience* (McGraw-Hill). Her newest book, *Transforming Relationships for High Performance: The Power of Relational Coordination* (Stanford University Press) explores how organizations achieve sustainable relational change in the face of performance pressure.*

Donor Story

Kenneth P. Moritsugu, M.D., M.P.H., F.A.C.P.M.
Rear Admiral, USPHS (Retired)



Dr. Kenneth P. Moritsugu lost his wife, Donna Lee Jones Moritsugu, in an automobile accident in 1992, and his daughter Vikki Lianne in a separate automobile accident in 1996. Both were organ and tissue donors. He has been intimately involved with organ and tissue donation and transplantation ever since.

He currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Washington Regional Transplant Community, and in 2007, the International Organ Donation Congress named him the first International Ambassador for Organ and Tissue Donation. In January of 2016, he was instrumental in organizing a plenary panel of former Surgeons General of the United States for the mid-winter meeting of the American Society of Transplant Surgeons, addressing "Transforming the Landscape of Organ Access and Transplantation: Surgeons General Perspectives." He is currently the Principal at First Samurai Consulting, LLC, a firm specializing in health consultation, "putting the patient at the center of what we do."

Rear Admiral Kenneth Moritsugu was the Acting Surgeon General of the United States, in 2002 and again from July 2006 until his retirement from the Commissioned Corps of the United States Public Health Service (USPHS) in September 2007. As Acting Surgeon General, he served as the nation's top doctor, communicating the best available science and information to the American people to help protect, promote, and advance their health and safety. In this position, he was the operational commander of the 6,500 Commissioned Corps health personnel of the USPHS.

Dr. Moritsugu resides in Great Falls, VA with his wife, Lisa R. Kory. He has two daughters, Erika Lizabeth Moritsugu, an attorney in Washington, DC; and Emily Renee Moritsugu.
