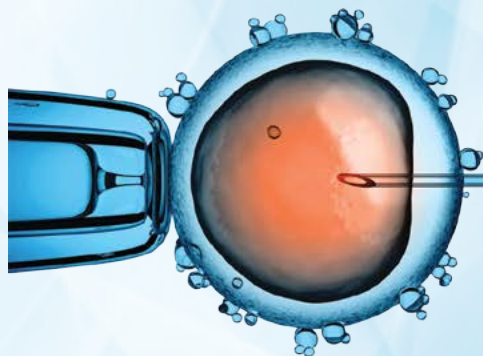

TARGET AUDIENCE

- Discuss a new therapeutic option in IF: personalized Embryo Transfer (pET);
- Recognize research on upcoming non-invasive diagnosis of human endometrial receptivity;
- Distinguish potential legal issues that could occur with the transfer of an embryo from a donor to a recipient.
