2022 DOCTOR SPEAKERS



Dr. Thomas R. Cheezum, OD, CPC, COPC was in private practice for 35 years after graduating from The Pennsylvania College of Optometry in 1978. After selling his practice in 2013, he has worked in a multi specialty medical practice providing medical eye care to a high risk Medicare aged patient base until 2018. Since 2018, he has done consulting work full time. He is a past member of the Virginia Board of Examiners in Optometry and past recipient of both the "O.D. of the Year" and "Distinguished Achievement" awards of the Virginia Optometric Association. He also does consulting work in the areas of record keeping, billing, coding and practice compliance with various government programs. He became an AAPC Certified Professional Coder in 2015 and consulted for the establishment of, and became the first O.D. to attain, the Certified Ophthalmology Professional Coder credential.

Dr. Walter Whitley, OD, MBA, FAAO practices at Eye Care Associates of Nevada in Sparks, NV where his practice encompasses ocular surface disease, glaucoma, surgical co-management and clinical research. Prior to relocating to Nevada, Dr. Whitley helped create one of the premier surgical co-management networks at Virginia Eye Consultants in Norfolk, VA. Dr. Whitley is a nationally recognized author and lecturer on topics ranging from ocular disease, surgical co-management, pharmaceuticals and practice management topics. He serves as co-chief medical editor for Modern Optometry, contributing editor for the Review of Optometry and co-medical editor for Dry Eye Coach. Dr. Whitley is the Immediate Past Chair of the American Academy of Optometry Anterior Segment Section and the immediate past president of the Virginia Optometric Association where he has been recognized as the 2012 Young Optometrist of the Year, the 2015 Legislative Keyperson of the Year and most recently the 2020 Optometrist of the Year.



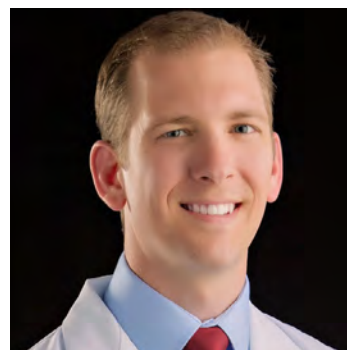

He is published in *Optometry and Vision Science*, *Review of Optometry*, *Optometry*, *Primary Care Optometry News*, *Advanced Ocular Care*,

Optometric Management, *Review of Optometric Business*, *New OD*, and *Optometry Times*. He hosted the "Ask the Eye Doctor" State College radio show. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Optometry, and a member of the American Optometric Association, the Pennsylvania Optometric Association, and Mid-Counties Optometric Society. He is an adjunct clinical professor at the Pennsylvania College of Optometry (PCO).

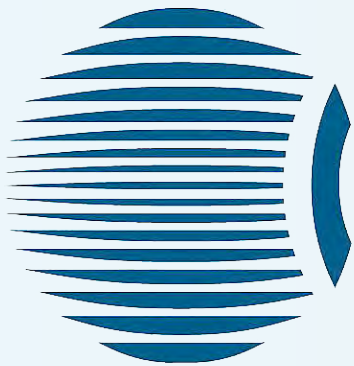

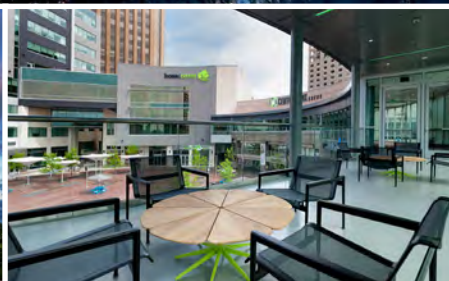
