Transportation

From Billings-Logan International Airport

As you leave the airport, you will come to a round-about. Go straight through this down the hill on 27th Avenue (Airport Road). Follow 27th Ave through downtown, all the way to I-90. Merge onto I-90 West and go about 10 miles to exit 434 for Laurel/Red Lodge. Go left at the bottom of the ramp onto Hwy 212. Follow 212 for about 45 miles to Red Lodge. Go through downtown Red Lodge and continue Hwy 212 for 5 more miles to Rock Creek Resort, which will be on your left.

From the East:

If you are coming in from I-90 or I-94 from the east/south, Use these directions from Billings. From Billings, head west on I-90 for about 10 miles to exit 434 for Laurel/Red Lodge. Go left (south) at the bottom of the ramp onto Hwy 212. Follow 212 for about 45 miles to Red Lodge. Go through downtown Red Lodge and continue on Hwy 212 for 5 more miles to Rock Creek Resort, which will be on your left.



From the West (Bozeman Airport)

From Bozeman, head east on I-90 for about 99 miles to exit 408 for Columbus. Drive through Columbus, following signs for Hwy 78. Follow Hwy 78 for about an hour to Red Lodge. Turn right on Hwy 212 (Broadway). Go through downtown Red Lodge and continue Hwy 212 for 5 more miles to Rock Creek Resort, which will be on your left.
