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London Live Endoscopy 2015

Overview

We are delighted to invite you to the 6th London Live Endoscopy course! This annual course aims to encourage, challenge, and educate all those aiming to deliver excellence in clinical endoscopic practice. To achieve this the programme incorporates a combination of live endoscopy, state-of-the-art lectures, 'tricks and tips' breakout sessions, and 'hands-on' delegate tutorials. The meeting is held in the Education Centre at UCH, with simultaneous transmission from 3 endoscopy rooms in UCH. As well as our local team, we will be joined by an outstanding national and international faculty, all of whom are at the forefront of driving excellence in endoscopy.

Course Aims

A full range of diagnostic and interventional endoscopy will be covered during the course. We hope to learn together not only "how to do it", but "when to do it". Although focusing on endoscopic scenarios common to clinical practice we will also introduce and demonstrate endoscopic techniques and technology new in 2015! We believe that the course will appeal to established consultants, endoscopy nursing staff, and endoscopy trainees, and provide a real chance to advance individual endoscopic skills and decision making.

Live Endoscopy

Our expert faculty and endoscopy team will be demonstrating a wide range of procedures in upper GI endoscopy, colonoscopy, ERCP, EUS, and cholangioscopy. The cases will be projected in high definition from 3 rooms in parallel, from the adjacent endoscopy suite at UCLH.

State-of-the-art lectures

Our internationally renowned faculty will deliver focussed lectures on topics relevant to our clinical practice, and introduce what's new, and what's coming, to endoscopy in 2015.

'Tricks and tips' breakout sessions

These popular sessions provide an informal opportunity to focus on specific endoscopic techniques and approaches, each led by 2 expert faculty. Sessions will include:

- Upper GI tract stricture management – Balloons, bougies, lasers, stents
- Biliary stones + stricture management – Kit, tricks, and tips
- Techniques for enhanced polypectomy - Caps, Cuffs, and Competence

Hands-on endoscopy tutorials

An innovation that we led on in 2014, the 'Hands On Suite' will be delivered again. A range of new and advanced endoscopy models allow faculty-directed tutorials related to a range of therapeutic interventions, including EMR, haemostasis, clipping, diagnostic EUS, and therapeutic ERCP. These sessions allow focused learning, and excellently complement other aspects of the live course, and advance our goal of enhancing endoscopic confidence, competence, and decision making.

Nurses programme

Endoscopic excellence is a team effort, and excellence in nursing care is vital for ensuring excellent outcomes. A dedicated endoscopy nurse programme will be delivered, providing a focused chance for hands-on training in endoscopic accessories, and discussion topics on optimising patient care.

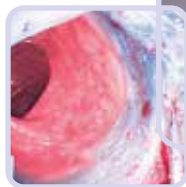

We hope that the course will be an opportunity to talk, meet friends and colleagues, and perhaps take in the attractions of London.

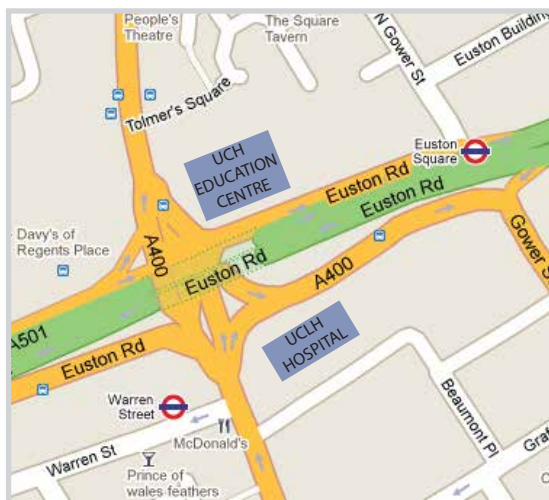

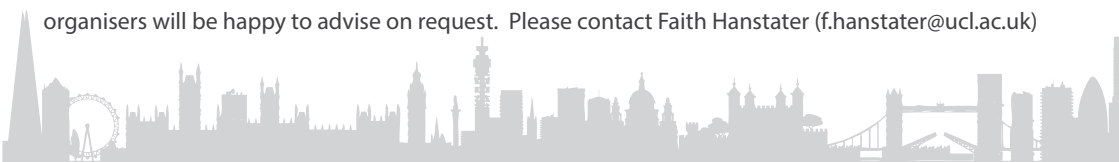


Tube Links:
