1200-1300 **All that sniffles and itches: An update on the management of rhinitis and urticaria**

Many children are suffering from allergy-related symptoms such as allergic rhinitis and urticaria in Canada, and the prevalence is increasing. Many therapeutic options are available over the counter, and others through prescriptions. This session will discuss the environment in Canada (prevalence, cause, diagnosis), the guideline for management in children, and discuss new treatment options available in Canada (e.g. Rupatadine).

1200-1300 **Identifying malnutrition in the children I care for**

This session will review the definition of malnutrition beyond measures of anthropometry and discuss how an imbalance of nutrients can affect physiological, immunological, and cognitive health outcomes. In addition, it will look at nutrition-focused clinical assessments for paediatricians such as nutrition fads, with attention paid to children on the Autism Spectrum, and other sensory processing disorders, who have shown to be at increased risk of micro- and macronutrient deficiencies. Lastly, this session will identify food insecurities with associated malnutrition, and controversies over which laboratory markers are useful in the diagnostic work-up.

1200-1300 Identification of critical neurologic conditions in children

This session will discuss in broader terms the identification of critical neurologic conditions in children. This will include clinical exam, conditions for which gene therapy is available, and how has gene therapy changed trajectories for these children. In addition, presenters will address how paediatricians would care for these populations in a longitudinal way.

Delivered by international experts, this scientific program explores innovations, emerging evidence, and controversies within the context of clinical neonatology. This includes patent ductus arteriosus, necrotizing enterocolitis, and therapeutic cooling. Additionally, top rated research abstracts submitted to the CPS in neonatal-perinatal medicine will be presented.

1100-1200 Early nutrition and immunity: Progress and practice

This session will provide an overview of the infant immune system and the impact that nutrition can have on the development of this system. The session will emphasize the importance of breast milk from an immunity perspective, and build into other aspects that paediatricians or family physicians will benefit from. For example, the neonatal gut microbiome, pre- and pro-biotics, debunking nutritional myths encountered in practice, and any new evidence or current controversies with vitamin D supplementation. Additionally, the session will address what the evidence has to say on new ingredients in infant formula, such as 2-FL oligosaccharide, that are being researched for their immune-benefits to babies that are not exclusively breastfed.

Sessions will be facilitated by local experts and will encompass the following topics: IV fluids, paediatric sedation, fever in < 3 months of age, and the challenges of managing acute medical conditions in patients with autism. The goal of these sessions is to utilize a combination of available evidence and expert opinion to help navigate these common yet challenging scenarios.

1230-1330 Child and adolescent lipid screening and management

Cardiovascular disease is a leading cause of death. Primary prevention is developed in adulthood and rapidly evolving in paediatrics. Evidence suggests that atherosclerosis begins in childhood and is associated with modifiable risk factors, such as obesity. Moreover, inherited disorders of lipid metabolism (familial hypercholesterolemia) are common (1:250) and often undiagnosed until a catastrophic event occurs in young adulthood. Therefore, primary prevention of CVD must start from childhood.

1230-1330 Children's health after climate-related disasters: Implications for Canadian paediatricians

This session will provide an overview of recent climate-related disasters in Canada and the immediate, moderate and long-term health impacts on children, including existing strategies to deal with the problem.

Are you providing state-of-the-art, adolescent-friendly contraceptive care to your patients? This session will help you reach these goals. Drawing from the 2018 CPS statement, this session will review the recommendations, and help you implement them in your practice. Particular attention will be placed on long-acting reversible contraceptives (LARCs); on new contraceptives on the market; and on increasing access to contraception in your practice, in your community, and in your province.

1600-1700 Physician health and wellness

According to a statement by the Canadian Medical Association, physicians are at a higher risk of experiencing adverse health and mental outcomes. Without a healthy and resilient physician population, patient care and health system performance suffers. In this session, speakers will address factors that affect physician health with a special focus on challenges through varying career stages, women in leadership and opportunities for peer support.

1600-1700 What the tooth? Basic oral health care

This session will review the importance of infant oral health exams, normal oral anatomy and physiology, anticipatory guidance, recommendations regarding fluoride and nutrition and recognition and treatment of dental caries.

Issues of focus will include health care consent, confidentiality in child and youth health, child protection, and professional responsibilities in clinical practice.

This session will present a systematic approach to conversations in the setting of serious illness or complex health conditions. There will be a focus on practical tools, approaches and principles that can be integrated into routine paediatric practice.

It is well understood that the conditions in which children are born, grow, live and play—the social determinants—help shape their health outcomes. Indigenous children are also affected by determinants such as cultural continuity, health care systems, colonialism, and social exclusion. Transforming these systems- and societal-level determinants offers the potential for lasting improvements to persistent health inequities. The speaker will explore the conditions required to bring about such changes, and offer examples of where transformation is under way.

1600-1700 From streets to systems: Unpacking violence and its effects on children and youth in Canada

The UN Convention on the Rights of a Child declare that our children have the right to freedom from all forms of violence. From mass shootings to hate speech and rhetoric, children and youth today are at great risk of being exposed to and impacted by direct violence. Yet, in unpacking the roots of violence, we must understand how structural, historic and systemic discrimination, in particular racist and xenophobic discrimination, perpetuates these atrocities.

The focus of this session is to provide practical tips for early diagnosis and management of the most common urological conditions seen in general paediatric practice.

Speakers will present on topics in paediatric infectious diseases that are relevant to general paediatricians as there is new knowledge or management remains controversial. Constructing a developmental approach and managing mental health problems in gender diversity

Gender diverse children and youth have experienced increased visibility and require health care services that are sensitive to their needs. This session will improve provider knowledge and familiarity with the health care needs of this vulnerable population.

1230-1330 A real poop show! The diagnosis and management of *C. difficile* in children

C. difficile is frequently detected in paediatric stool samples but the interpretation of this finding can be challenging. Newer laboratory testing practices may be leading the over diagnosis and treatment of *C. difficile* in children. Recent epidemiological studies using molecular techniques and case control design have revealed the frequency of colonization with "toxigenic" strains, particularly in pre-school aged children. This session will review our updated understanding of the epidemiology of *C. difficile* in children, including low and high-risk populations for development of disease. Attendees will also learn of recent changes in the recommendations for testing and management of *C. difficile* in children, including a discussion of the limitations of various approaches.

This session will review topics such as the use of intermittent ICS/LABA in children and the diagnosis of asthma in preschool children.

This session will focus on functional and structural examination and management of common and sometimes serious eye problems in children. A case-based approach will be used to discuss management of conjunctival and corneal diseases, eyelid disorders, and the globe injuries in children. This session will include illustrative cases to highlight important learning points and a quiz for participants to apply what they learn in order to update their knowledge of eye disorders in children.

1230-1330 This might have saved her life: Stabilization care for illicit drug overdoses

Opioid overdose has become one of the leading causes of death for youth due to the rise of fentanyl in the illicit drug market. This session will explore an approach to life-threatening substance use in youth that is currently being piloted by hospital-based paediatricians in British Columbia. State of the science material about the opioid epidemic and its impact on children, promising strategies for providing medical care for this population, and preliminary outcomes will be shared.

Doctors take an oath to treat all patients equally, and yet not all patients are treated equally well. The answer to why is complicated. We now recognize that racism and discrimination are deeply ingrained in the social, political, and economic structures of our society. For Black, Indigenous and other people of colour (BIPOC individuals), these differences result in unequal access to quality education, healthy food, livable wages, and affordable housing. Practical steps to incorporate an anti-racism lens in medicine, and in the provision of patient care will be discussed.

1600-1700 **Paediatric systemic lupus erythematosus: Everything you ever wanted to know but were afraid to ask!**

This interactive, case-based session will impart an approach for children with suspected paediatric systemic lupus erythematosus (pSLE). It will highlight timely strategies to help with diagnosis, management and complications common in patients with pSLE. This session will also offer guidance on ordering and interpreting autoantibody tests, and managing immune-suppressing medications; as well as anticipatory guidance relating to bone and reproductive health, e.g., contraception, neonatal lupus.
