Overview

Pancreas cancer, including patients at risk, as well as pancreatitis are among the most complex cases that physicians are confronted with as internists, gastroenterologists, oncologists, and surgeons. The Pancreas Symposium 2021 program will review cutting-edge diagnostics and treatments as well as those on the horizon for pancreas diseases, both benign and malignant. This year's program will feature renowned experts in pancreas cancer care, diagnostics and pancreatitis.
