LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Integrate into daily practice evidence-based recommendations on new and emerging therapies for common dermatologic diseases.
- Implement updated strategies for managing acne, rosacea, atopic dermatitis, contact dermatitis and actinic keratosis.

- Examine energy-based technology for body contouring and discuss appropriate patient selection criteria for utilizing these devices.
- Evaluate the role of dermoscopy in clinical practice and demonstrate enhanced skill in using this technique to diagnose dermatologic disorders.
- Analyze emerging treatments for onychomycosis.

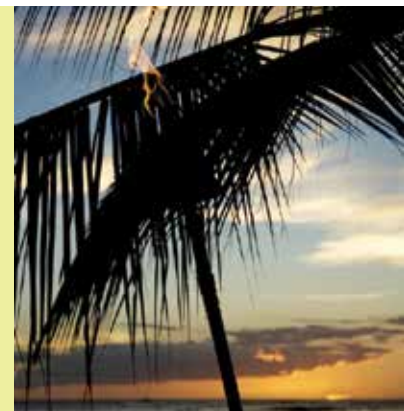
