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2015 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD JOHN ZERWAS, M.D.

Texas House of Representatives, District 28

Saturday, September 12, 9:30-10:00 a.m.

Representative John Zerwas, M.D. is proud to represent the citizens of House District 28 in the Texas House of Representatives for his fourth legislative term. House District 28, currently one of the fastest growing regions in the State of Texas, is made up of a diverse mix of urban, suburban, and rural populations in northwestern Fort Bend County.

Representative Zerwas currently serves as the Chair for the House Committee on Higher Education. This is his first term to serve as the chair of this committee. Prior to serving on this committee, Chairman Zerwas has been an advocate for graduate medical education and increasing access to higher education. Zerwas also sits on the Committee on Public Health. As a physician he brings firsthand experience and knowledge to the committee.

A physician for more than 30 years, Representative Zerwas is one of three doctors in the Texas House of Representatives at a time when Health and Human Services is one of the fastest-growing areas of spending. Dr. Zerwas has served as president of the American Society of Anesthesiologists. More than a decade ago, Dr. Zerwas co-founded a Houston area group practice which recently became known as US Anesthesia Partners, and he remains active in the operations of the partnership. Representative Zerwas has earned numerous accolades for his dedication to public service including being named one of the "Ten Best Legislators" by Texas Monthly for his work during the 81st and 82nd legislative sessions. Among other recognitions, Representative Zerwas has been recognized by the Texas Medical Association as a "Friend of Medicine" and Texas Hospital Association as a "Texas Hospital Advocate" for his commitment to healthcare for Texans.



John and his late wife, Cindy, graduated from Bellaire High School in 1973 and were married in 1978. After graduating from the University of Houston, Representative Zerwas earned his Doctorate in Medicine at Baylor College of Medicine in 1980 and started a full-time private practice in 1985. John and Cindy have four children, John Jr., Joseph, Brandon, daughter-in-law Monica, Sherry, son-in-law Matthew, and two grandchildren, Isabella and Matthew.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This activity is designed for anesthesiologists and resident anesthesiologists from Texas and surrounding states.

EDUCATIONAL METHODS

The educational methods consist of didactic lectures, workshops and hands-on sessions with opportunities for Q&A from the audience and panel discussions.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The practitioner of anesthesiology must possess the scientific background for clinical practice and must maintain state-of-the-art knowledge of not only the specialty, but of all additional related disciplines which may impact it. The anesthesiologist must serve as an expert in matters involving health care delivery, and serve as an informed manager of clinical and educational services provider. The anesthesiologist must maintain an up-to-the-minute armamentarium of knowledge skills for the selection and use of complex equipment, pharmacological agents and procedures necessary for the provision of quality patient care. As more surgical procedures are performed outside the operating room, anesthesiologists must be familiar with the various clinical settings and medical emergencies he/she may be confronted. Anesthesiologists must consistently update their knowledge level and skills. At the conclusion of this CME activity, attendees should be able to:

- Summarize HHSC Sunset Legislation from the 2015 Legislative Session and the upcoming Sunset Reviews on the Texas Medical Board, the Texas Nursing Board and 18 other health care specialty licensing boards; Review Insurance Legislation from the 2015 Legislative Session and their implementation at the Texas Department of Insurance along with any other regulatory rules initiated at the Texas Department of Insurance which affect anesthesiologists; Analyze updates on policy issues which affect anesthesia and their status on a national level as well as an update on federal policy issues; and Review the legislation from the 84th Legislature on which the Texas Society of Anesthesiologists engaged.
- Identify physiologic changes during pregnancy that require alteration of anesthetic management; Classify hypertensive disorders of pregnancy; and Compare the pros and cons of remifentanyl for labor analgesia.
- Define clinical features and discuss preoperative diagnosis of placenta accreta, increta, and percreta; Identify risks for massive hemorrhage in the obstetric population; and Describe anesthetic techniques used for cesarean delivery.
- Describe the anatomic and physiologic changes of pregnancy and their effect on airway management.
- Identify physiologic changes during pregnancy that require alteration of anesthetic management.
- Analyze current diagnostic criteria and current management options on hypertensive disorders of pregnancy.
- Compare the pros and cons of remifentanyl for labor analgesia.
- Define clinical features and discuss preoperative diagnosis of placenta accreta, increta, and percreta.
- Identify risks for massive hemorrhage in the obstetric population.
- Describe anesthetic techniques used for cesarean delivery.
- Compare the pros and cons of neuraxial analgesia for labor; and Identify the pros and cons of alternate analgesic techniques, such as opioid patient-controlled analgesia.
- Explain the use of hypothermia for neuroprotection.
- Define persistent post-surgical pain; and Explain current concepts for management of Persistent Post-Surgical Pain.
- Assess the problems in infants born addicted to opioids.
- Explain the anatomy of the Fontan repair and of the single ventricle palliation pathway that leads to the Fontan repair.
- Define massive transfusion; Recognize the ASA Guidelines on Transfusion; and Discuss transfusion strategies when massive transfusion is necessary.
- Identify risk factors for rising prevalence of perioperative pediatric thromboembolism (VTE).
- Describe the characteristics of the difficult pediatric airway based on findings from the multicenter difficult airway registry (PeDIR).
- Describe the role of anesthetic drugs and techniques in order to minimize complications related to rapid sequence intubation.
- Explain how RSI is often used to secure an airway in uncooperative, full stomach, unstable or critically ill patients.
- Explain how handoffs impact patient care in the peri operative period; and Explain the significant role of teamwork during management of a perioperative crisis.
- Analyze treatment modalities for blunt and penetrating trauma; and Utilize TEE to aid in diagnosis of blunt and penetrating injuries.
- Define permissive hypotension; and Compare the risks and benefits of using a permissive hypotension resuscitation strategy versus a traditional resuscitation strategy while caring for the complex trauma patient in a heterogeneous population with variable injuries.
- Define the value of transfusion protocols and timing of component therapy in the resuscitation of the trauma patient.
- Explain the various components of the intraoperative evaluation of the bleeding patient.
