

Course Overview

For the past eighteen years, the Connecticut Trauma Conference has provided high quality education in trauma, critical care, and injury prevention. The Program Committee has invited local, regional and national experts in the field, some of whom have spoken here in the past. The keynote speaker is a trauma survivor who speaks nationally on his experience as a trauma patient. Other topics include sports-related injuries, airway management, disaster and new and cool topics in trauma care. The final session will focus on violence in healthcare environments. This conference is designed to educate caregivers across the spectrum of trauma care, including pre-hospital providers, nurses, midlevel practitioners and physicians of all specialties.

- To discuss the unique aspects in the care of sports-related injuries.
- To discuss disaster management with a focus on active shooters and bleeding control.
- To discuss the challenges with pediatric airway management.
- To review current concepts in the management of penetrating trauma.
