About the Course

This course is designed for urologists who are seeking to acquire knowledge or enhance their abilities to perform robotic urologic surgery. Didactic presentations will cover robotic technology, patient selection, indications and contraindications, patient preparation and positioning, OR setup, stepwise surgical techniques of various robotic kidney, adrenal, prostate and bladder surgeries. Review of large series results and complications associated with robotic surgery. Live case demonstration will include robotic partial nephrectomy. A step-by-step demonstration of the technique using unedited movies will cover adrenalectomy, prostatectomy, and radical cystectomy.

Hands-on porcine model lab is available for those interested participants to be proctored for placing ports and performing robotic pyeloplasty, partial nephrectomy and radical nephrectomy. Two participants per robot. The purpose of this course is to teach urologic surgeons how to perform robotic urologic procedures.

Target Audience

Urologists who have experience with urologic surgery seeking to acquire or enhance their abilities to perform robotic procedures in particular robotic partial nephrectomy, nephroureterectomy, radical prostatectomy, and radical cystectomy are encouraged to attend.

Objectives

After participating in the course, the participant will:

- Define appropriate patient selection, the indications and contraindications of robotic urologic surgery.
- Explain patient preparation, OR setup, robotic instrumentation and patient positioning.
- Identify the surgical techniques needed for robotic partial nephrectomy, robotic adrenalectomy, robotic pyeloplasty, robotic prostatectomy and robotic cystectomy.
- Demonstrate the complications associated with robotic renal and pelvic surgery, their prevention, recognition and management.
