October 17 – Shanghai, China



Shanghai is China's most populous city, consisting of two districts, Puxi and Pudong. A major world financial center and transport hub, Shanghai offers a multitude of diverse attractions. Take a nighttime riverside stroll along The Bund (Wai Tan) for sweeping views of Shanghai's light-ed skyline. Get a view from above in the Oriental Pearl Tower (Dongfang Mingzhu), where you can stand above the city streets upon glass walkways. Meander stone paths in a traditional Chinese garden, Yu Garden (Yuyuan), with Koi ponds, bridges, historic buildings, and natural features. Surrounding shops and vendor stalls carry crafts, silks, ceramics, clothing, and other goods.

October 19 – Busan, South Korea – Day Open



Busan is Korea's second largest city. Here, there are many Buddhist Temples located deep within the region's mountains. The Beomeosa Temple, founded in 678 AD, is perhaps one of the most frequented temples in the area. For art and history buffs, Busan offers several museums and historical buildings like Busan Museum, Busan Museum of Art, and Busan Modern History Museum. If scenery is your thing, try visiting Dongbaek Island, or birdwatch at the Nakdong river estuary. Haeundae Beach is great for walking along the ocean. It's host to festivals throughout the year, and food vendors are available nearby with fresh fish delicacies.

Ride the glass-bottomed cars of the Maokong Gondola to the Taipei Zoo. Enjoy tea and delicacies in a teahouse at the terminus. A vigorous hike up Elephant Mountain (aka Nangang District Hiking Trail) also allows for stunning views of the city. Visit a traditional Buddhist and Taoist temple, Longshan Temple, to see the detailed architecture and enjoy a bubble-tea afterwards in the nearby shopping district. Art enthusiasts will enjoy the National Palace Museum which houses calligraphy, antique pottery, historical war weaponry, and ceramic masterpieces.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING YELLOW FEVER VACCINATION:

The Chinese government takes all health matters seriously. On February 13, 2017, the China AQSIQ (General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine) issued a notice requiring ALL PERSONS (9 months and older, regardless of nationality) who have entered and/or transited through a country with risk of Yellow Fever, including Brazil, and/or, Angola, and/or, Congo within the past 30 days, to obtain and present a yellow fever vaccination certificate to China health officials in order to enter China.

The yellow fever vaccine must be administered and dated a minimum of 10 days prior to arrival into China. The vaccination certificate must be fully completed, signed, dated and stamped by a medical practitioner.

If a Yellow Fever vaccination is contraindicated (not medically possible), an exemption letter must be issued by your medical practitioner and must be brought with you to China. Local health officials will then decide if a vaccination waiver may be issued. The exemption letter must be written on your medical provider's letterhead, signed and dated by the clinician and include the practice's stamp.

Guests without the correct documentation
may be denied boarding by local health officials.
