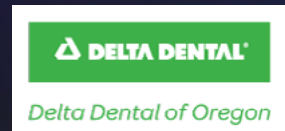

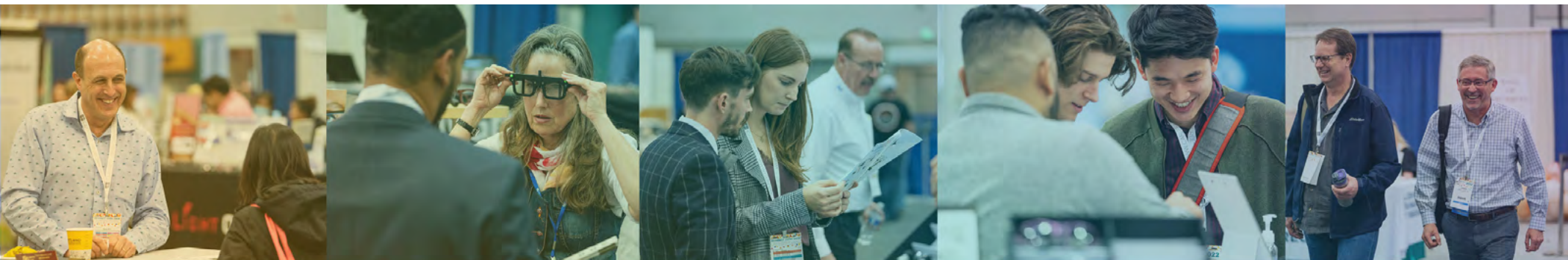

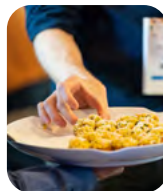

Current Status of Dental Adhesives, Composites, and Light Curing Technology

The current state of dental adhesives and composites presents the practitioner with many material options having a broad range of physical properties and handling characteristics. The current materials have evolved based on the needs and requests of dental practitioners desiring materials capable of being used in more extensive applications, and with greater ease of use. This course will describe currently available systems for achieving adhesion to tooth structure and compare their properties and clinical performance when used with dental composites. Dental composites will be presented in terms of the different types of materials on the market, and the introduction of materials with reduced polymerization shrinkage and shrinkage stress, and enhanced depth of cure for use as bulk-fill restoratives. This topic will include a full discussion of dental light curing procedures. Likely future materials development will be discussed, including composites that are considered “bioactive,” self-adhesive, and capable of self-repair.

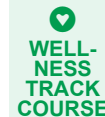

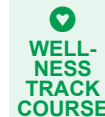

At a time when there is a dental assistant shortage in Oregon, it is important to help the community by providing education and training to those interested in becoming dental assistants but who may be unable to attend a full-time CODA-accredited dental assisting program. For students who are not enrolled in a dental assisting program and are studying on their own, this DANB pathway can be challenging. 2022 was another incredibly active year for legal updates and new regulations and 2023 is shaping up to be as well. It is becoming urgent for everyone to understand and implement the Department of Labor's cyber security soft guidance (which is already showing up in enforcement). The DOL has been raising eyebrows with guidance on topics ranging from investments in cryptocurrencies and ESGs to a mandatory offering of a retirement plan benefit to long-term, part-time employees.

The House of Representative passed the Securing a Strong Retirement Act of 2021 (SECURE 2.0) on a vote of 414–5. Action has now moved to the Senate which is considering the Enhancing American Retirement Now Act (EARN). Be prepared by learning about these important legislative initiatives and which are likely to move forward in 2023 and beyond. Obtain critical information about how this legislation and legislation passed over the last 24 months affect your practice. In April, it will have been 20 years since the HIPAA Privacy Rule was enacted; it was followed over the years by the Security, Breach Notification, and Omnibus rules. Ransomware, Form Grabber, Scareware, Onion Routing, and Root Kit weren't even words back then. Add in scammers, hackers, and bogus security systems plus the questions of what's required and what's not; what's safe and what's not; what's secure and what isn't are definitely moving targets.

HIPAA has stated it's going "to get the best return for its buck," so now is definitely not the time to be guessing what to do. And with recent rule amendments, increased attention to auditing safeguards, patients' rights of access, and confusing new laws like the Cures Act, dental practices are plagued more than ever with what's required and what's not.

Insulin resistance (IR) is considered a chronic and low-level inflammatory condition. It is closely related to altered glucose tolerance, abdominal obesity, and coronary heart disease. IR is accompanied by an increase in the inflammatory cytokines like interleukin-1 and 6, tumor necrosis factor- α . Levels of these cytokines also effect the progression of IR. Periodontitis is the most common oral diseases. Pro-inflammatory cytokines are released in the disease process of periodontitis, including IL-1 and IL-6. Periodontitis can be attributed with exacerbation of IR.

Data in the literature supports a “two-way relationship” between diabetes and periodontitis. The co-existence of systemic and oral inflammatory diseases warrants closer examination by dental professionals. Appropriate health history questions and review is essential in helping patients maintain oral health.

In addition, conscious sedation is used increasing in all areas of dentistry. Attendees will gain a greater understanding and skill in interpreting pulse oximetry and capnography on minimally or moderately sedated patients. Emphasis will be placed on both information that is conveyed and what is missing from these various devices.

Traditionally the inflamed pulp was thought incapable of healing, but recent advances in biologic understanding and techniques have brought this thought into question. 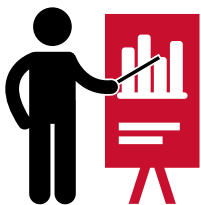

Occlusion and TMD

Twenty-First Century Protocols

Dentists are keenly aware that occlusion is important in dentistry, as it is the foundation of proper function. But the role of occlusion in Temporomandibular Joint Disorders (TMDs) is more complex, and today we know that some of our previously accepted treatments were anecdotal in nature, rather than evidence based. A 2016 literature review found 78 studies that investigated the relationship between occlusion and TMDs. Fifty-three of those studies (68%) found a relationship, while 25 of the studies (32%) did not. However, the relationships were weak and not specific to any given occlusal factor. One in five of these studies cited an anterior open bite as the most common malocclusion. But an anterior open bite could be the result of a TMD and not the cause.

We now know that while earlier etiological theories of TMDs emphasized dental morphological factors of malocclusion, occlusal disharmony, and poor mandibular alignment as being primarily responsible, today, it is generally agreed that the etiology includes a multifactorial combination of physical and psychosocial factors. Dentists are the only healthcare providers who change a patient's occlusion, so we need to understand the role of occlusion in muscle disorders and how this differs from the role of occlusion in intracapsular disorders. This course is designed to explain these differences and help the provider better manage cases, with the ultimate goal being orthopedic stability.

At the conclusion of this course, attendees will be able to:

- ◆ Identify cases of orthopedic instability within the masticatory system
- ◆ Recognize the concept of stable malocclusions and their relationship to joint position
- ◆ Recommend conservative treatments that are not irreversible
- ◆ Differentiate between occlusal problems and problems with joint loading
- ◆ Identify the role of adaptability as it relates to masticatory function

Every dentist needs to know about temporomandibular disorders (TMDs), since one in six patients are experiencing or have experienced orofacial pain. This pain interferes with eating, talking, and personal expression. It can deeply affect an individual's functional and psychological well-being. A revolutionary, first-of-its-kind, prospective, longitudinal study of 4,000 patients over five years was published in 2011. The Orofacial Pain: Prospective Evaluation and Risk Assessment (OPPERA) study found that TMDs are a complex set of conditions with a biopsychosocial model of illness, and as such, it is no longer appropriate to regard TMDs as a localized jaw/dental condition. Additionally, many of these patients suffer from chronic overlapping pain conditions. The time is now to bring the mouth back inside the body and work to remove silos between dentistry, medicine, and behavioral health. This course is designed to teach general dentists how to assess and manage their TMD patients using a multidisciplinary approach.

At the conclusion of this course, attendees will be able to:

- ◆ Identify unique characteristics of the temporomandibular joint (TMJ)
- ◆ Recognize the multifactorial etiology of TMD
- ◆ Recommend behavioral management guidelines for patients with facial muscle pain associated with TMD

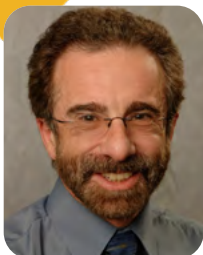

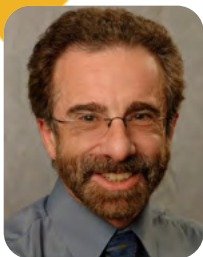

The dental health care provider plays an important role in all aspects of oncology care, from prior to diagnosis, before, during and following active cancer therapy. This presentation will focus on cancer survivors. Cancer survivors represent approximately 4% of the general population, and may seek oral/dental care more frequently as they may experience more frequent dental disease and oral complications of cancer treatment. Cancer survivors may also have unique needs and require special considerations in their management due to past or continuing oncology care. The oral health care provider has a responsibility for continuing care of previously treated cancer patients. General issues of cancer survivors including complications of cancer treatment, fatigue and cognitive changes affect the delivery of dental care. Appropriate care must be provided at the appropriate time and may require coordination with medical care. Oral complications of cancer therapy are common in survivors and can be the most debilitating of complications of cancer treatment.

At the conclusion of this course, attendees will be able to:

- ◆ Understand the impact of cancer therapy upon the oral status
- ◆ Understand the prior cancer care ongoing oncology care that impact oral care

While dental care focuses on teeth and periodontium, taste is a critical oral function. The sensation is an “orphan” function with limited knowledge, and awareness by health care workers. Taste is a critical and highly redundant sensory function. Taste is critical in appetite, diet, and nutrition. Taste protects the host from ingestion of potential toxins and damaging products. Taste and oral health is supported by saliva. Dramatic increase in research attests to the importance of the symptom. Taste and saliva are appropriately in the dental realm.

Recent technological advancements on several fronts have created a paradigm shift in the field of implant surgical guides. Cone beam CT, additive manufacturing (3D printing), point cloud merging, and recently AI have combined to make CBCT derived surgical guides cost effective for not only fully guided cases, but for pilot drill guides. When your patient pays for a CBCT scan, he/she owns that data, and has the right to have that data directly linked to his/her implant placement. Many practitioners are under the impression that CBCT derived guides represent a complicated process that involves scanning appliances and multiple CT scans. Most do not realize that scanning appliances are now virtually obsolete. This presentation will discuss the simplified workflow that is now possible in 2023.

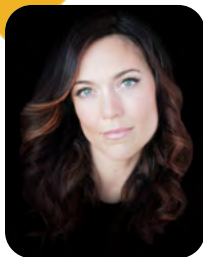
