GOALS / OBJECTIVES

Bridging Gaps to Achieve Even Better Care is intended to increase the participants knowledge base in subject areas that are timely and relevant.

Understand the evolution of the paravertebral block. The evidence based use of data for the use of TAP blocks and adductor canal blocks will be presented.

Specify the relevance of postoperative pulmonary complications and the role of protective mechanical ventilation in their minimalization.
