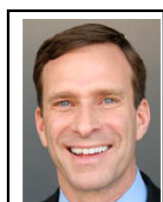

Course Information

Course Objective

This intensive three-day course in forensic psychiatry will provide an in-depth review of selected topics and relevant landmark cases. Basic concepts will be reviewed along with the latest case law. At the conclusion of the course, participants will: (1) have a good understanding of the major topics in forensic psychiatry; (2) understand the landmark mental health law cases; (3) be able to write more effective forensic reports; (4) be able to assess competency and sanity in defendants; and (5) be able to detect malingered mental illness.

Format

Teaching methods will include lectures, report writing exercises, discussion of videotaped vignettes and informal interaction with faculty. A comprehensive, 1,100-page syllabus with lecture outlines, 100 case summaries, report samples, reading lists, and over 700 self-assessment questions will be accessible online to all participants at no extra cost.

Continuing Education
