► **UNDERSTANDING AND USING THE 1997 MEDICARE E&M DOCUMENTATION AND CODING GUIDELINES: KNOW YOUR REAL WORTH** | David Ruiz, MD, FAAFP

Despite the transition to "Pay for Value," MACRA/MIPS, and increasing focus on Quality/Performance metrics as drivers of clinician compensation, the only quantitative measures of our throughput (thus our worth within most compensation models) remain net revenue, and the "Work RVU." Though literature is limited, it does suggest in general, clinicians may leave as much as 30% of potential income on the table due to documentation not accurately reflecting the complexity of clinical work performed.

Most clinicians do not receive adequate training on this topic during the course of professional education. This workshop will provide a fundamental understanding of E&M (evaluation and management) documentation principles in the outpatient environment, determining level of service. They are applicable across most specialties, and care environments. Myths regarding complexity/simplicity of documentation requirements will also be dispelled. Knowledge is Power.

► **TRAINING IN SUICIDE CARE FOR PROVIDERS**
Jeffrey Sung, MD

Training in Suicide Care for Physicians and PAs promotes the providers leadership role in understanding and addressing this preventable cause of morbidity and mortality.

The structure for a six-hour workshop targeting general competence in suicide risk assessment, treatment and management is based on existing practice guidelines: the SPRC Core Competencies in Suicide Risk Assessment and Management, the APA Practice Guideline for the Assessment and Treatment of Patients with Suicidal Behaviors (2003) and the National Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention's report, Suicide Care in Systems Framework (2011).

These practice guidelines outline knowledge, attitudes and skills related to:

- Attitudes and approach
- Knowledge about suicide
- Suicide risk assessment
- Suicide risk formulation
- Suicide risk management
- Treatment of suicide risk
- Documentation and legal issues
- Responding to patient suicide

This course includes a Power Point presentation with videos. A/V equipment to display the videos with sound is requested.

The Washington State Department of Health requires course evaluations in order to track data on training. A course evaluation will be provided for all participants for feedback on the course content and speaker.

IMPORTANT: This curriculum has been approved by the Washington State Department of Health to meet the requirement for training in suicide risk assessment, treatment and management for health care professionals.
