The Board of Directors are pleased to dedicate our 22nd annual meeting of the California Association of Oral Maxillofacial Surgeons to a stunning example of commitment to our specialty, Timothy S. Shahbazian. His career contributions to Oral Maxillofacial Surgery on local, state, and national levels have benefitted each of us. His talents as an educator have enlightened many students and residents alike.

Tim grew up on an 80-acre raisin farm outside of Fresno. Working on his family's farm honed the habits of early rising and long days of hard work. Following his senior high school year as an AFS Exchange Student in Austria, he began his education at UC Davis. Tim graduated with Highest Honors in Bacteriology and was elected to the Phi Beta Kappa Honor Society.

He attended UCLA School of Dentistry and was awarded the Regents One Year Fellowship in Oral Biology following graduation. He was also a popular instructor in the Section of Gnathology and Occlusion as well as Operative Dentistry, receiving the Outstanding Instructor Award from several UCLA dental classes.

Tim completed his Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery residency at Louisiana State University and returned to California where he settled into private practice in Fremont. During his time in private practice, he served NCSOMS, CALAOMS and AAOMS. His committee work in Risk Management, Relative Values, Legislative and Political Action, Anesthesia and Health Care Advocacy has made us better individually and collectively. In 2010 he was recognized by AAOMS as Committee Person of the Year for his work on the Health Care and Advocacy Committee.

Having known Tim since residency I know he loves to teach. When he sold his practice in Fremont and accepted a position in Chicago at the Hines VA, I was excited for his new opportunity. It did not take long for him to corroborate with Dr. Stephen MacLeod, Loyola University's Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Program Director and make arrangements to have the residents rotate through the VA. Whether Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery or GPR residents he creates an environment to learn and is affectionately referred to as "Shabo" by his students. “THE CHANGING FACE OF SURGERY & PATHOLOGY IN THE 21ST CENTURY: A CLINICO-PATHOLOGICAL CORRELATION”

Synopsis of Presentation:

This course will concentrate on new developments in oral pathology including, in particular, the use of monoclonal antibodies, immunohistochemistry, and genomic studies, including the use of multiple sequencing equipment which can simultaneously sequence up to 500 genetic variations for difficult diagnosis. The talks will concentrate on oral lesions which have traditionally been treated with surgery, but may now be treated medically. These include the central giant cell granuloma and the odontogenic keratocyst. All instruction will be in the form of Clinico-Pathological Correlation (CPC) format with maximal audience participation.

Educational Objectives: Upon completion of this course,

1. the attendee will be aware of advances in oral pathology to include advanced staining techniques, utilizing antibodies, as well as immunohistochemistry.
2. attendees will realize the value of genomic sequencing in those cases where the diagnosis of a lesion is difficult and they will be aware of advances in sequencing which enable multiple genetic variations to be examined simultaneously.
3. attendees will be aware of those lesions which were previously treated surgically but can now be treated medically in many cases. These include the central giant cell granuloma and the odontogenic keratocyst.
4. attendees will understand the relationship between different oral lesions, depending on immunohistochemical markers.

Dr. Richard Jordan ~ Bio:

Richard Jordan is an oral/head & neck pathologist with expertise in the diagnosis and pathology of head and neck tumors. He is a national leader in biospecimen banking for national phase 2 and 3 clinical cancer trials and in AIDS. Since 2008, he has served as Director of the NCI-sponsored NRG Oncology (formerly RTOG) Biospecimen Bank leading biobanking activities at locations in San Francisco, Houston, Pittsburgh and at the Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus Ohio. His role as Director and PI also includes membership on many NRG Oncology Steering Committees. This leadership role permits him to contribute to the development and testing of new cancer therapies that positively impact patient care. Dr. Jordan serves as pathology study chair for six ongoing large-scale multi-institution cancer trials where he reviews and provides second pathology opinion on several hundred enrolled cases each year. He has been Director of the AIDS Specimen Bank since 2018 and continues to play an active leadership role in biospecimen banking and scientific research for CFAR and MWCCS (formerly WHIS). His expertise in biospecimen banking and the pathology of human diseases is important to this project adding unique expertise that complements the CFAR enterprise.

Dr. M. Anthony Pogrel ~ Bio:

Tony Pogrel received his dental degree in 1967 from Liverpool University in England and his medical degree from Aberdeen University in Scotland in 1974. He then received further general surgery training and Oral and Maxillofacial training in Great Britain, Holland, and Miami, Florida. In 1979, he was appointed consultant oral and maxillofacial surgeon in Peterborough and Cambridge in England and since 1983, has been full-time faculty of the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of California, San Francisco. He is a former chairman of the department (1994-2014) and is currently a professor. Dr. Pogrel holds both medical and dental licenses in California and is board certified in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. He is a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons, the American College of Surgeons, American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, the British Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, the International Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, the International and American Associations of Dental Research and the American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons. Dr. Pogrel has more than 210 publications in the literature on a variety of topics and is a frequent presenter at specialty meetings nationally and internationally.
