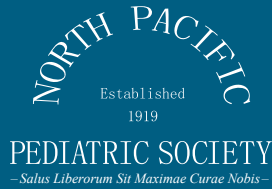

OBJECTIVES:

- Describe the stages of feeding development, the roles of the parent and child in each stage, and potential problems associated with each stage
- Differentiate between normal and abnormal feeding development, and identify children at risk due to abnormal feeding, and describe approaches to manage children at risk
- Identify the different stages of sleep and common disorders
- Describe the common use of sleep studies indications and value
- Discuss recent science and practice of mindfulness-based interventions with adolescents
- Identify a brief mindfulness practice that you can use in your personal life and clinical practice
- Recommend mindfulness resources for youth, families, and professionals
- Recognize that 48% of child fatalities each year are a result of physical abuse, and that the majority of these children are under 4 years old
- Develop differential diagnoses for common orthopedic and rheumatologic presentations (such as leg pain) in their office setting
- Determine when to refer children with leg pain complaint to sub-specialties
- Design treatment plans for patients with atopic dermatitis and psoriasis
- Describe and treat a variety of rashes that occur in the diaper area
- Identify common nail changes in children and appreciate their associations with other disease
- Identify which patients are good candidates for an Aerodigestive evaluation and refer to the Seattle Children's Aerodigestive Program.
- Determine appropriate primary medical management and practice appropriate referral practices for pediatric aero-digestive disease
- Use concepts to understand the breadth of medical, surgical, and therapeutic management alternatives for pediatric aero-digestive disease as they relate to airway and swallowing.
- Use concepts to identify and manage abnormal newborn and childhood penile anatomy and foreskin concern.
- Apply concepts to understand the anatomy of the inguinal canal scrotum and management of undescended testis, hydrocele, and hernia.
