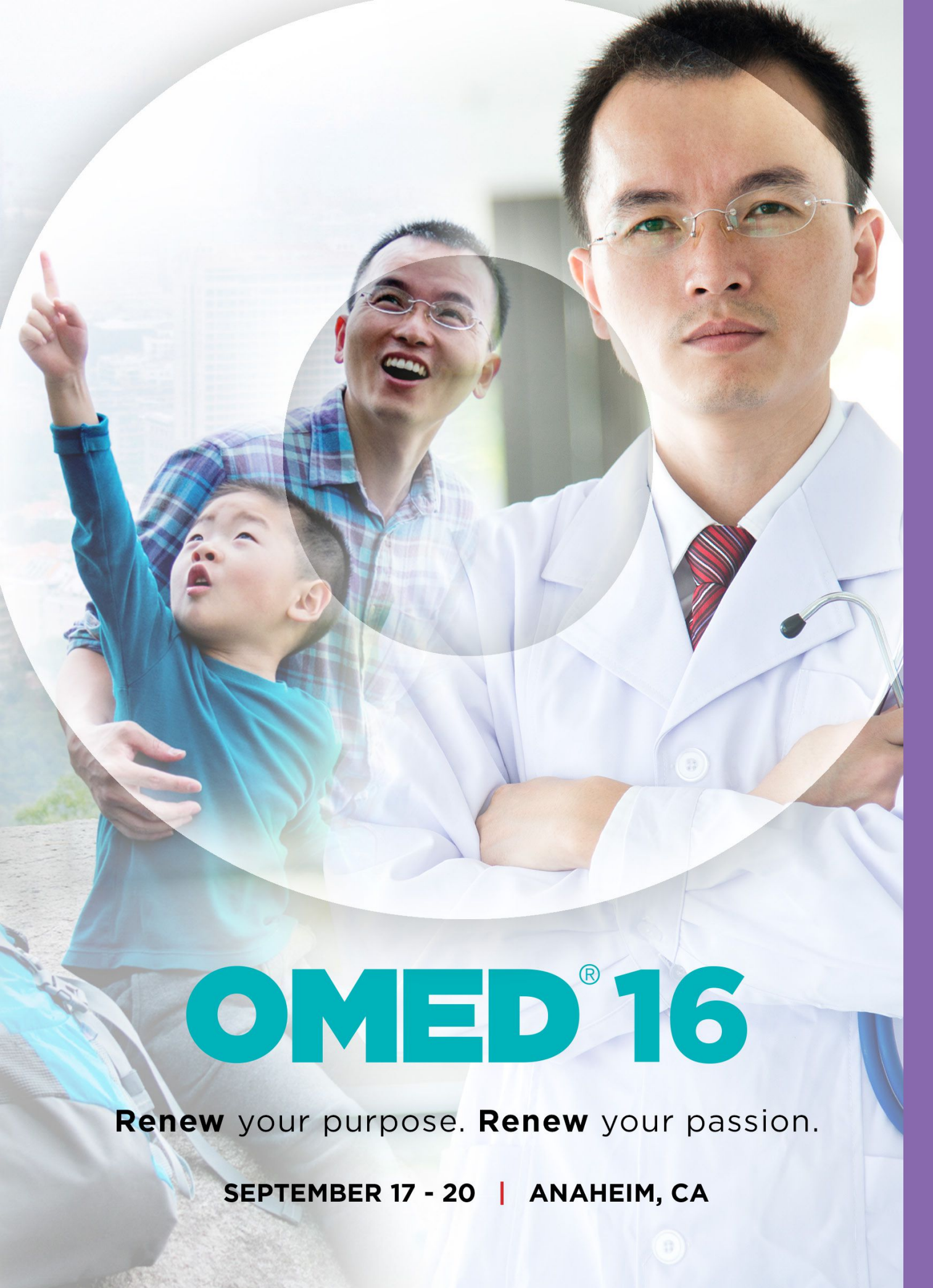

The Role of Motor Control in Musculoskeletal Rehabilitation and Injury Prevention

Presenter: Richard Schuster, DO, and Shawn Kerger, DO, FAOASM

Presentation Summary:

The evaluation of motor control has evolved significantly beyond what Drs. Phillip Greenman and Vladamir Janda proposed nearly twenty years ago, as it relates to injury prevention and rehabilitation. Recent work by Comerford and Mottram, Zazulak, Cholewicki and Akuthota, along with developments by Janda's students, will all be reviewed and explored. Special emphasis will be placed upon the practical interpretation of this research as it relates clinically to the evaluation of motor control applied to both injury rehabilitation and prevention. The initial didactic will be a review of recent research, while the laboratory will focus on the clinical evaluation of motor control, how it is influenced by somatic dysfunction, and abnormal motor programming might perpetual somatic dysfunction. We will be using the upper and lower cross syndromes as templates for the evaluation for, and treatment of, abnormal motor control.

Objectives:

- (1.) Discuss the role of motor control as it relates to musculoskeletal injury, rehabilitation and injury prevention.
- (2.) Practice and demonstrate the evaluation of most motor control patterns for the upper and lower extremity cross syndromes.

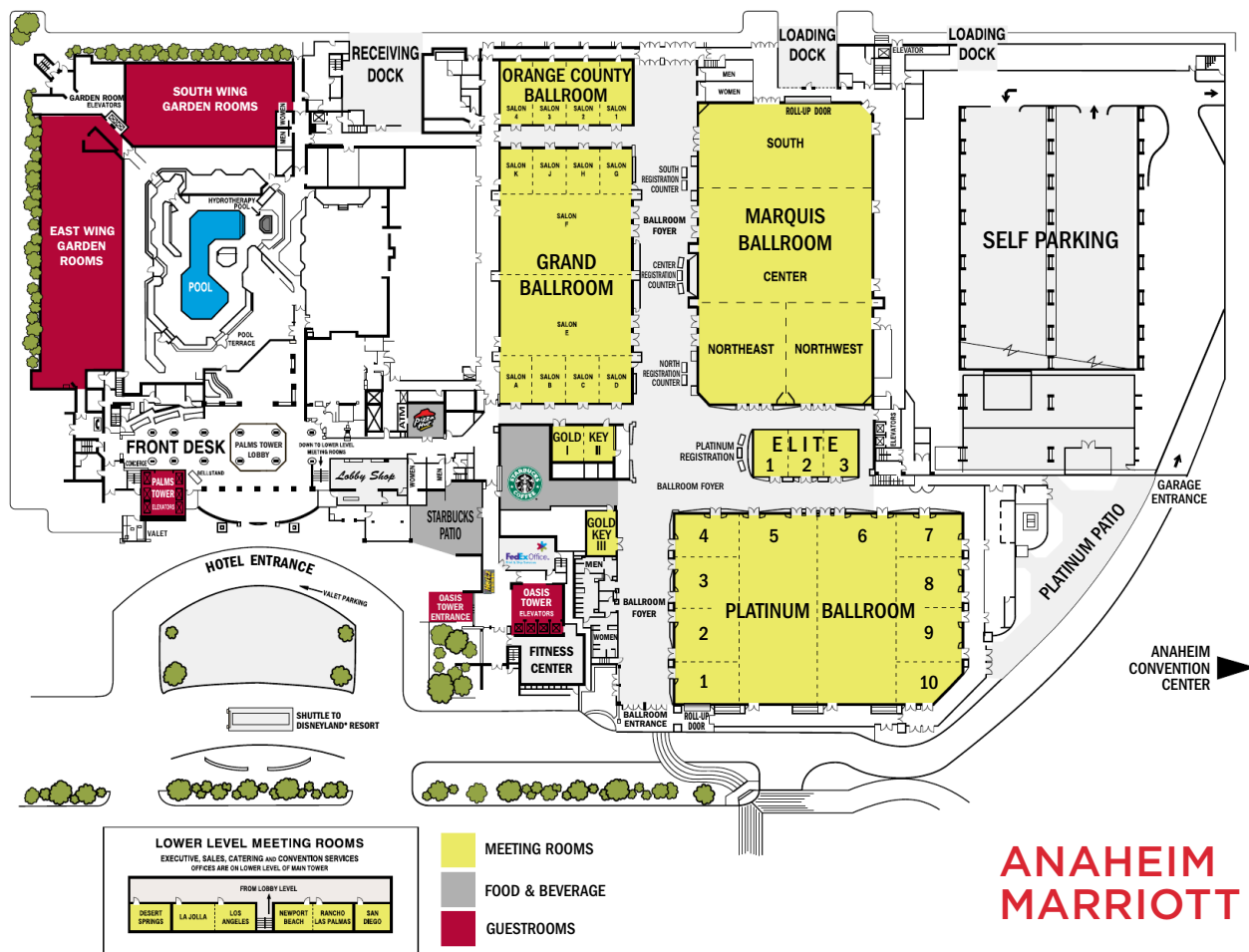

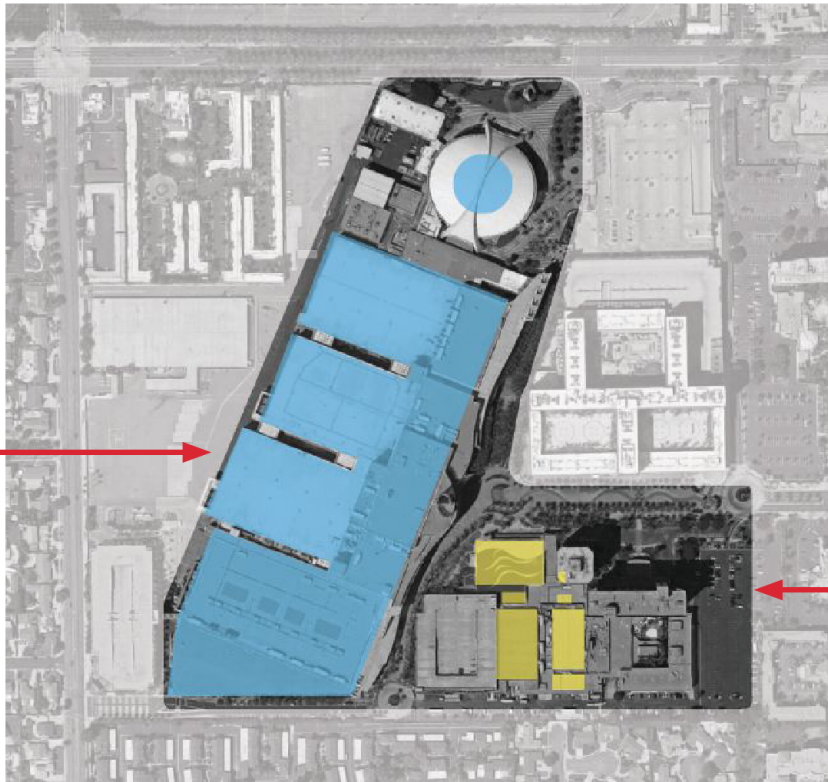

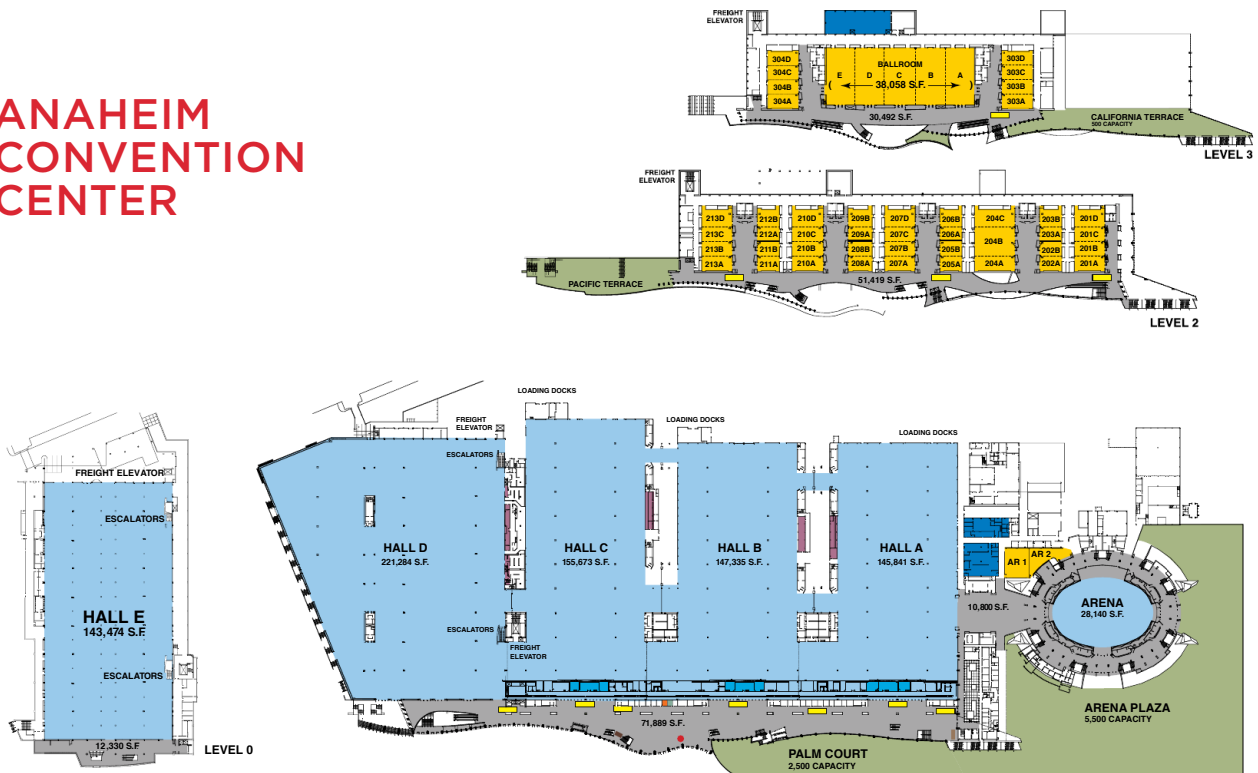

Security, Safety and Emergency Procedures

Anaheim Convention Center

In the event of a medical emergency while on-site at the Anaheim Convention Center, the following steps should be followed:

- For serious medical emergencies (cardiac arrest, profuse bleeding, seizures, anaphylactic shock, seizures, etc.), please dial 911. If you are unable to reach 911, please dial 8080 from any white house phone. This will set in motion a response that includes the Anaheim Fire Department, paramedics, Convention Center Security and the first aid staff.
- For non-emergencies, minor incidents and first aid, please notify Building Security, by dialing the operator on any of the white house phones, located throughout the building.
- In the event of an earthquake, the best option is to remain calm and to 'Duck, Cover and Hold'. Be aware of your surroundings and look up for objects, such as light fixtures, that may fall and be prepared to move

out of their path. Look for a desk or table or something solid to get beneath to protect yourself from falling objects; stay away from large panes of glass. Listen for announcements and follow the direction of Convention Center Personnel.

- When and if full evacuation is necessary, Anaheim Convention Center security, staff and contract staff will guide all persons at the facility to the appropriate exit location. The convention center has a state-of-the-art detection and alarm system. When triggered, horns and flashing strobe devices, accompanied by a pre-reordered announcement, activate in the effected zone. If you are in such area please move immediately to an emergency exit. Remember that elevators and escalators will be available for use during an evacuation. If you are in the lobby level meeting rooms move toward the emergency staircases, located at either end and in the middle of the meeting room. Convention center personnel will respond quickly to assist with the evacuation and with re-entry once the emergency is passed.

Marriott Anaheim Safety and Emergency Information

- To report a loss, property damage or other incident, please contact the security dispatcher by dialing zero for the operator and requesting the security department. The security dispatcher will notify 911 in the event it is necessary to have the paramedics respond to the hotel.
- In the case of fire, guests are notified and instructions given via public address speakers located throughout the hotel. In the event of an evacuation, guests should go to the nearest stairwell and exit the building.
- In the event of an earthquake, please stay calm. If you are indoors, move away from windows, glass and items which may topple. If possible, take cover under a sturdy desk or table. Duck down and cover the back of your head and neck. After the shaking has stopped, security and management will check the building to ensure safety.
