24th Annual Meeting Dedicatees

Jerry Moss (Posthumously), Goldenvoice and Skip Paige

The 2024 CALAOMS Annual Meeting is dedicated to three very important individuals and organizations. Mr. Jerry Moss was cofounder of A&M records (with Herb Albert) and was an instrumental figure and generous contributor, facilitating the many accomplishments of California CareForce (CCF). I met Mr. Moss through Mr. Stan Brock who founded Remote Area Medical (RAM). In its infancy, CCF began as RAM California, an affiliate of RAM. Being that RAM's headquarters are located in Tennessee, it wasn't feasible logistically to drive the equipment across country to California for clinics. Mr. Moss generously donated funds to CCF, enabling CCF to purchase our own equipment and gaining our independence, therefore we changed our name to California CareForce. We also had the generous and dedicated support of Goldenvoice, including Paul Tollet, Bill Fold, and committed Goldenvoice staff along with Mr. Skip Paige. Goldenvoice held the vision to host CCF's free medical/dental/vision clinics in Coachella because of the profound lack of access to care in the Valley. Skip Paige helped orchestrate the innumerable details involved in hosting a clinic which was fully funded by Goldenvoice. Goldenvoice also supported CCF's efforts to purchase our own equipment. To date, Goldenvoice has funded eight clinics in Indio. These three individuals and organizations' dedication to and generous support of California CareForce has enabled the medical, dental, and vision care for thousands of residents. Sadly, Mr. Moss passed away on August 16, 2023. His wife, Tina, carries on his charitable endeavors. I will be forever grateful for all of them for their huge part in the success of California CareForce.

Distinguished Service Awardee ~ Dr. Alan S. Herford

Committee Member of the Year ~ Dr. Peter Scheer

Dr. Scheer was selected as our 2023 Committee Person of the Year. The title "Committee Person of the Year" does not adequately or sufficiently encompass everything that Dr. Scheer has done for the profession of oral and maxillofacial surgeons and CALAOMS. Dr. Scheer was an integral member of a group of OMSs that spearheaded CALAOMS's vision and realization of passing the Elective Facial Cosmetic Surgery legislation, SB 438. He testified at many legislative committee hearings on behalf of OMSs. Dr. Scheer has also been an important leader in helping the under served, championing California CareForce's efforts in providing staff, supplies, funds, and outreach to medical and dental practitioners, community leaders, and patients. Dr. Scheer also generously provided after-clinic care for those patients who could not complete their oral surgery service at the clinic. Dr. Scheer was one of the first OMSs to have a training facility to help OMSs get cases needed for their EFCS permits.

His group, Medical Anesthesia Consultants, grew extensively over the years, becoming the largest private practice group in the Bay Area. Dr. Poage previously served as the Medical Director for the John Muir Health/Stanford Children's Health Alliance. He currently provides mobile pediatric and adult anesthesia care throughout the Bay Area. Dr. Poage is a Past President of the California Society of Anesthesiologists and serves on the Committee on Governmental Affairs for the American Society of Anesthesiologists. He has been an advocate for safe patient care and physician wellness within organized medicine.
