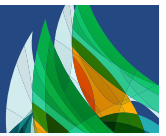

James Withers, MD

Medical Director and Founder, Pittsburgh Mercy's Operation Safety Net; Founder, Street Medicine Institute; Teaching Faculty, UPMC Mercy; Assistant Professor, Clinical Medicine, University of Pittsburgh



In 1992, Dr. Jim Withers dressed as a homeless person and joined a formerly homeless man to visit the street dwellers of Pittsburgh, making "house calls" at night. This initiative led to his program, Operation Safety Net (OSN) that brings medical care and social services directly to the unsheltered homeless. It also serves as a pioneering "classroom" for

students of various disciplines to learn the principles of reality-based care. In 2005, Dr. Withers established the annual International Street Medicine Symposium (with current partners in North America, South and Central America, Europe, Australia, Africa and Asia) to foster collaboration in the care of those sleeping on the streets. In 2009, Dr. Withers created the new non-profit Street Medicine Institute to promote the global practice of street medicine. In 2019, Dr. Withers created the first Street Medicine Fellowship at the UPMC Mercy Hospital of Pittsburgh.

Dr. Withers is in practice with the Pittsburgh Mercy health system, on the Internal Medicine teaching faculty of UPMC Mercy Hospital and an Assistant Clinical Professor of Medicine at the University of Pittsburgh.

Dr. Mona Hanna (commonly known as Dr. Mona and formerly known as Dr. Mona Hanna-Attisha) is the Associate Dean for Public Health and C. S. Mott Endowed Professor of Public Health at Michigan State University College of Human Medicine. She is the founding director of the Pediatric Public Health Initiative, an innovative partnership of MSU

and Hurley Children's Hospital in Flint, Michigan. She is reimaging how society can come together to eliminate infant poverty with a first-in-the-nation program, Rx Kids. A pediatrician, scientist, activist, and author, Dr. Hanna-Attisha was named one of Time magazine's 100 Most Influential People in the World and recognized as one of USA Today's Women of the Century for her role in uncovering the Flint water crisis and leading recovery efforts. Dr. Hanna-Attisha is the author of the widely acclaimed and New York Times 100 most notable book, *What the Eyes Don't See: A Story of Crisis, Resistance, and Hope in an American City*

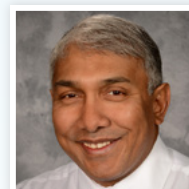

GIM FELLOWS PRE-COURSE

WEDNESDAY, MAY 14

11:00 AM - 5:30 PM

General Internal Medicine (GIM) fellowships train future leaders in clinical investigation, clinical education, health policy, government, and public health. Despite the presence of fellowships across the country, there are few structured opportunities for GIM fellows to network with one another and meet leaders from other institutions. Attendees of this session will network with colleagues and faculty from across the country while receiving expert feedback on their current work.

Agenda for this precourse includes:

- Plenary talk, and discussion of the first-ever SGIM Fellowship Survey
- Panel discussions with GIM Chiefs, and former fellows; and
- Breakout sessions during this interactive workshop.

Topics include:

- How to build local peer and mentorship teams;
- Building national communities;
- Applying and negotiating for a first academic job;
- Optimizing the transition from fellow to faculty;
- Engaging in team science; and
- "Speed Dating" for networking and collaboration.

CURRICULUM ON IMPROVING THE DIAGNOSTIC PROCESS THROUGH A LENS OF HEALTH EQUITY: A TRAIN-THE-TRAINER PRE-COURSE

WEDNESDAY, MAY 14

The National Academy of Medicine (NAM) defines diagnostic error as “failure to establish an accurate and timely explanation of the patient’s health problem(s) AND communicate that explanation to the patient.” Physician behaviors in the diagnostic process (DxP) can enhance or detract from achieving diagnostic excellence and affect both components of diagnostic error. The objective of this pre-course is to address two goals of the NAM report through a curriculum grounded in video observation and principles of health equity: 1) Identification of behaviors that facilitate or detract from effective teamwork in the DxP between physicians and patients; and 2) Provide educational interventions that addresses performance in the DxP including clinical reasoning and communication with patients.

In 2022 SGIM received a grant from the Council for Medical Specialty Societies to develop a curriculum to improve the DxP. Pre-course faculty crowd-sourced the expertise of SGIM members presenting at regional meetings and the annual meeting. The co-constructed curriculum comprises three modules, and a series of four full-length simulated encounters and six snippets of videos with probing questions to elicit learner knowledge and strategies in the DxP, followed by expert feedback.

Faculty will guide participants through an interactive train-the-trainer session. Instruction will focus on how to use the modules and accompanying facilitator guides with a range of learners, and how to optimize learner engagement in the video series. Participants will be guided through delivery of an effective mini-lecture providing foundational knowledge relevant to the content of the videos (e.g. testimonial injustice, perspective-believing). Participants will learn to facilitate the video observation portions; video observation is a powerful educational strategy that depersonalizes behaviors, allows for expanded observation of enhancing and detracting behaviors, and serves as a precursor to skill development.

Participants will engage in one module and then break into small groups to apply what they learned to the facilitator guides for one of the two remaining modules. Faculty will reconvene participants to facilitate the video series content. Participants will again breaking into small groups to facilitate video observation.

INTERNAL MEDICINE POINT-OF-CARE ULTRASOUND (IMPOCUS) PRE-COURSE

WEDNESDAY, MAY 14

Internal Medicine point-of care ultrasound (IMPOCUS) is becoming ubiquitous in training among hospitalists, outpatient clinicians, and residents practicing Internal Medicine. Usage is supported by organizations such as ACP, AMA, SHM, among others. As such, an IMPOCUS educational curriculum should be in place to help guide and direct IMPOCUS innovation and training at the UGE, GME, and CME levels to produce physicians with adequate competency in ultrasound use and to guide both diagnostic reasoning and therapeutic benefit. The first step for many clinicians and educators is a pre-course such as this one at a conference such as this one.

The pre-course will cover ultrasound basics, including basic ultrasound principles, physics, and terminology. Further education and skills-based sessions regarding basic ultrasound techniques for evaluating anatomy and pathology will be included using the PEARLS (MD) approach to the diagnostic US. The traditional “PEARLS” methodology includes the parasternal cardiac views; the epigastric views evaluating the aorta and inferior vena cava along with the subcostal view of the heart; the anterior lung fields or the thoracic exam; and the right upper quadrant, left upper quadrant, and suprapubic views making up the limited abdominal evaluation. The addition of the “MD” includes musculoskeletal and deep venous thrombosis examinations. The musculoskeletal examination will be taught at the first breakout session to demonstrate basic ultrasound principles and will only focus on broad classifications such as fascia, musculature, arteries, veins, and lymph nodes. Deep venous thrombosis scanning will not be taught in this pre-course but will be discussed as a component of the applications of ultrasound.

BUILDING A HEALTH LAW, POLICY AND ADVOCACY CURRICULUM PRE-COURSE

WEDNESDAY, MAY 14

1:00 PM - 5:00 PM

Physician voices are powerful in impacting healthcare laws and policies at the state and national levels. As medical trainees get first-hand experience regarding the impact of social drivers and systemic inequities on the health of their patients, advocacy can serve as a way to promote change and feel connected with the meaning and purpose of their work. However, most training programs lack a robust curriculum in these areas in part due to a lack of adequate expertise by the medical faculty. Moreover, the best curricula get learners actively engaged in the process of their own design, and advocacy is the perfect platform for such experiential learning. However, medical schools and residency training programs struggle to find ways to bring this teaching to medical trainees that fit with their busy schedules and provide direct experiential impact. The primary goal of this pre-course is to address this gap. The target audience will be clinicians and clinician-educators, with the ultimate goal of empowering them to teach trainees these subjects.

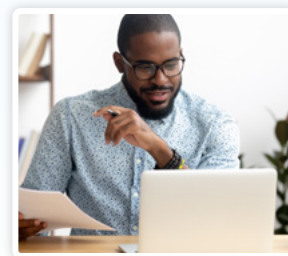
In this pre-course, we review the core elements of a health law, policy, and advocacy curriculum, and we will provide appropriate resources to ensure participants' success when they return to their institutions. This highly interactive pre-course will first outline the necessary elements of a health law and policy curriculum along with the necessary foundational information and a guide on how to create learner-driven advocacy experiences. The focus will be on the most critical subjects in such a curriculum and how to leverage available resources to be successful. Throughout the pre-course, participants will discuss individualized plans in a small group format and review them with the larger group. Participants will brainstorm the building blocks of their own curricula in health law, policy, and advocacy at their institutions. We will provide resources for identifying and tracking legislative issues and networking with local and national advocacy organizations.

Participants will leave with a toolkit of resources for building their own curriculum in health law, policy, and advocacy, including core content, learning objectives, intended audience, timeframe, key faculty, key stakeholders, and a how-to guide for setting up direct advocacy experiences at the state and national levels.

Applications for Sponsors and Sponsees opens on January 15, 2025. Deadline for applications is March 21, 2025.

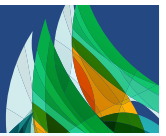

ABIM MOC STATEMENT

Successful completion of this CME activity, which includes participation in the meeting, and completion of the evaluation and assessment surveys, enables the participant to earn MOC points in the American Board of Internal Medicine's (ABIM) Maintenance of Certification (MOC) program.

Participants will earn MOC points equivalent to the amount of CME credits claimed for the activity. It is the CME activity provider's responsibility to submit participant completion information to ACCME for the purpose of granting ABIM MOC credit. SGIM only provides MOC for The American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM).

CODE OF CONDUCT



SGIM is committed to promoting diversity, which is expressed in myriad forms. Some examples include race and ethnicity, gender and gender identity, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, language, culture, national origin, religious commitments, age, (dis)ability status, and political perspective. This Code of Conduct Policy outlines our expectations for all those who participate in any SGIM virtual or in-person meeting as well as the consequences for unacceptable behavior.

We expect all participants in SGIM meetings to create safe and positive experiences for everyone. In doing so, we forge the best possible environment to advance SGIM's mission and support our core values. This policy is intended to prevent harassment and other misconduct. "Participant" in this policy refers to anyone present at an SGIM-sponsored National, Regional, or other meeting, including staff, contractors, vendors, exhibitors, venue staff, members, and any other attendees.

EXPECTED BEHAVIOR

We expect all participants at SGIM meetings (attendees, members, vendors, exhibitors, contractors, staff, and venue staff) to abide by this Code of Conduct Policy in all venues at SGIM National, Regional or other Society meetings, including ancillary events and official and unofficial social gatherings. The following is not an exhaustive list but is meant to guide attendees in interactions.

EXPECTED BEHAVIOR...

- Demonstrate respect and consideration for all people.
- Listen well to others. Make room for a diversity of voices in group discussions, on panels, and the like. Facilitators invite but be sensitive not to pressure those who have not communicated to do so.
- Be collaborative. Be mindful not to exert dominance over others. Consider the effect of relationship, position, experience, and privilege power differentials, and other factors to avoid dominance.
- Demonstrate that differing perspectives are valued – critique ideas (not people).
- Demonstrate welcome for a diversity of individuals and their identities – pay attention to whether individuals of many identities and roles are included on panels, leading sessions, being called on when they raise their hands, and having their points considered.
- Report conduct concerns to a Meeting official so that concerns can be addressed responsibly and timely.
- Respect confidentiality of the identities of any individuals involved in a conduct concern, while it is being reviewed and addressed.
- Answer questions about conduct concerns in a forthright and complete manner (e.g., when registering or during a review of concerns); and
- Immediately comply if any leader or facilitator of an activity/session, any official of the venue, or any Society official directs a participant to stop a behavior or comment. Please comply when directions are made to implement this Policy or the venue's policies. After Participants comply, they may raise any questions or concerns to a Meeting Official.

UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR...

- Engage in biased, demeaning, intimidating, coercive, or harassing/hostile conduct or commentary, whether seriously or in jest (e.g., based on power differential, actual or perceived gender [sex, identity, expression], sexual orientation, race, ethnicity or national origin, religion, marital status, veteran status, age, body size or other physical appearance, disability, or other identities). This is the opposite of respect and welcoming conduct.
- Engage in personal attacks.
- Intentionally talk over or interrupt others.
- Retaliate against or disadvantage anyone for reporting a conduct concern or assisting in its resolution. Do not make bad faith accusations.
- Disrupt the meeting or engage in violence, threats of violence, harm or threats of harm of any kind. Do not create/contribute to a safety threat or an unsafe or exclusionary situation. Firearms, knives and other weapons are not allowed at Society meetings unless specifically allowed by local laws.
- Invade the personal privacy of individuals, at times or in places where people can reasonably expect privacy. Meeting participants should not view, photograph, audio- or visual- record, or distribute photographs or recordings of, individuals (in any medium) where privacy can reasonably be expected.

CONSEQUENCES OF UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR

Unacceptable behavior from any participant at an SGIM meeting will not be tolerated. If a participant engages in unacceptable behavior, SGIM may take any action they deem appropriate, including removal from an SGIM National, Regional or other meeting (without refund) at which the harassment occurred. Egregious violations will result in more severe sanctions.

DETERMINING A VIOLATION

- SGIM has designated fact finders to understand the complaint, context and extenuating circumstances.
- SGIM has a Senior Officer who is responsible for immediate decisions (such as what to do during the meeting period.)
- SGIM has a body with Oversight Authority to review anything more than a simple complaint. This body can make decisions during the meeting period and after the meeting period. This body ensures fair and consistent decisions and is careful to avoid unwarranted defamation.
- Consequences may include encouragement to participate in a non-punitive, restorative process or community-building option.
- We will follow the principles of due process.

IF YOU ARE SUBJECT TO OR WITNESS UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR

If you are being harassed, notice that someone else is being harassed, or have any other concerns, please contact one of the Meeting Contacts immediately. A Meeting Contact can be identified by a badge with a purple flag.

If possible, provide the following information, preferably in writing:

- Identifying information (name/badge ID, appearance) of the participant about whom you have the concern;
- The behavior that was in violation;
- The approximate time of the behavior (if different than the time the report was made);
- The circumstances surrounding the incident;
- Other people involved in or witnessing the incident.

The Meeting Contacts are trained on how to deal with the incident and how to further proceed with the situation. If needed or requested, Meeting Contact will help participants contact venue security or local law enforcement, provide escorts, or otherwise assist those experiencing harassment to feel safe for the duration of the Meeting.

CONFIDENTIALITY

If the person raising the concern, any identified individual target, or the accused (each an "individual most directly involved") or a particular witness asks the Meeting Contact for confidentiality of their identity while the concern is being addressed, reasonable steps will be taken to do so. But the Society will not maintain confidentiality, if in its judgment and discretion, safety or law, an investigation, determination of a violation, or removal of a Participant from the meeting requires otherwise. Anyone who receives information during an investigation, however, must maintain its confidentiality. Failure to do so is a serious violation of this Policy, as is retaliation against any identified individual target, witness, or anyone who raises or helps resolve a conduct concern.

INVESTIGATIONS AND APPEALS

If you are accused of or being investigated for unacceptable behavior, this complaint will be processed fairly. You may contact SGIM CEO or Deputy CEO to describe your perspective. Any grievances will be handled in accordance with our existing governing policies.
