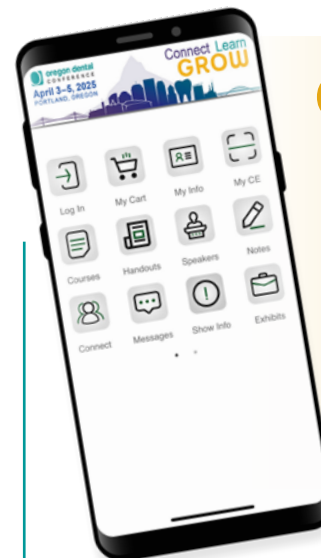

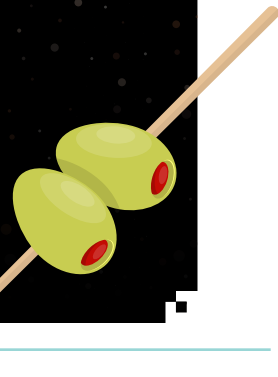

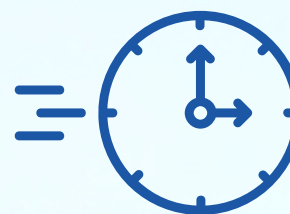

Herbal medicines now fall into the category of complementary and alternative medicines (CAMs). Herbal supplements are receiving increasing exposure through national media, in lay journals, and more recently in the scientific press. Although the growth of the herbal medicine industry in the U.S. is unlikely to continue indefinitely at its current pace, there is little indication of any major slowing. Many patients will continue to use herbal medications; one survey found that an estimated 12.3 million adults (5.4% of the population) used alternative therapies as a substitute for costly prescription medications. With the popularity of CAMs, a new issue has arisen: herbal-drug interactions, of which oral healthcare professionals (OHCPs) must be aware. A survey of patients with heart disease, diabetes, psychiatric disorders, and/or hypertension found that 79% were taking supplements concurrently with prescription medications. Among those with cardiac disease, 20% reported regular use of herbals. About 16% of patients with diabetes and 16% of patients with psychiatric disorders reported regular use of CAMs. These results underscore the prevalence of supplement use and the potential for herbal-drug interaction. The OHCP needs to be aware not only of these products' effects and advantageous synergies, but also of their side effects and potential adverse drug reactions. Critical patient populations are emphasized and specific herbal-drug interactions that can lead to increased bleeding, decreased blood glucose levels, and sedation changes are discussed.

- ♦ The herbal medications and drugs of greatest concern to dental professionals
- ♦ The ways in which levels of risk for herbal-drug interactions are evaluated
- ♦ The medical and dental implications for drug interactions with specific herbal medications
- ♦ Special considerations of herbal-drug interactions for pregnant or breastfeeding dental patients

Nitrous Oxide and Dental Personnel Concerns

This course is designed to mitigate any concerns dental staff may have when working in offices where nitrous oxide – oxygen inhalational sedation is provided. Perfect for every clinician, hygienist or team member who may be under the impression that the chronic environmental exposure to nitrous oxide could result in some type of fetotoxicity or teratogenicity in an expectant employee; this program debunks that myth. This comprehensive review of animal studies, early non-clinical trials which led to the development of safer masks and scavenging systems, and finally clinical trials which reinforce the wide margin of safety that this gas provides, this is a foundational course for all oral healthcare practitioners. As the late Dr. John Yageila said, "There has never been a death in a dental office, while dentistry is being done and nitrous oxide is the sole sedative being used." This level of safety is not only imparted to our patients, many of whom may be pregnant, but to our frontline workers who may be considering starting a family but are concerned about working in an office where nitrous oxide – oxygen inhalational sedation is provided. Case studies will augment the delivery of key points and a problem-based learning approach is encouraged so that each participant's questions are addressed. After all, if the oath we all took upon graduation was to, "First, do no harm," then why would you not want to offer your patients and staff the best and safest treatment possible?

At the conclusion of this course, attendees will be able to:

- ◆ Discuss the challenges with some of the early animal studies investigating the safety of nitrous oxide
- ◆ Understand the clinical significance of a well-fitting nose-piece or mask
- ◆ Keep their office safe with a checklist from the ADA Advisory Panel on nitrous oxide safety
- ◆ Recognize the proposed biochemical pathway in which nitrous oxide could be associated with teratogenicity
- ◆ Appreciate the overall safety of nitrous oxide – oxygen inhalational sedation and how to counsel and advise staff on measuring and minimizing any potential occupational exposure

Dr. Dubois is an oral and maxillofacial radiologist in private practice at her company Oral Radiology Experts. She primarily works with CBCT review and reporting, but also has expertise in plain film and MRI interpretation. She received her DMD from Tufts University School of Dental Medicine and completed a GPR at the University of Washington. After working many years as a general dentist, she noticed the need for more radiologic support to improve patient outcomes and dentists' peace of mind. She returned to the University of Washington to complete her specialization and opened her practice upon completion. Dr. Dubois enjoys lecturing throughout the country to help practitioners brush up on their radiology skills and meeting dentists from all fields to learn how radiologists can better integrate into the dental team.

Baseline CBCT knowledge of anatomy and common incidental findings is crucial, but these images are most often taken with a specific region of interest. Lastly, oropharyngeal airway and hard tissue evaluation will include potential markers for obstructive sleep apnea risk.

The roles of the monolithic restorations, universal adhesives, and digital, need to be understood and implemented in every dental practice. As a practicing clinician and as the director of education and technology at Utah Valley Dental Lab, Dr. Hornbrook has a unique perspective of these changes in what he has coined "living on both sides of the bench". With a practice focused on metal-free, all-ceramic aesthetic based dentistry, Dr. Hornbrook understands the importance of predictability, ease of use, and long-term success when deciding which restorative material and cementation option will provide the best results. Indigenous Oral Health*How to Provide Culturally Competent and Effective Care*

This program will detail current oral health disparities faced by indigenous people, primarily (but not exclusively) summarizing the 2023 CareQuest Institute for Oral Health's White Paper: *American Indian and Alaskan Native (AI/AN) Communities Face a 'Disproportionate Burden of Oral Disease'*, written in collaboration with the Northwest Portland Area Indian Health Board (NPAIHB). After establishing an understanding of the current burden of disease and oral health concerns facing the AI/AN population, the program will allow participants to identify obstacles to care and cultural considerations (traditions, expectations, hesitations, and values) for indigenous patients in public and private health care settings. The bulk of the presentation will provide tangible and useful knowledge, information, and strategies to improve AI/AN oral health outcomes and treatment plan acceptance in any office through a personal history of receiving dental care as an indigenous person, as well as lessons learned currently serving Native Oregonians.

At the conclusion of this course, attendees will be able to:

- ◆ Describe current oral health disparities affecting indigenous peoples in the U.S., with specific focus on the Pacific Northwest
- ◆ Identify current obstacles faced by indigenous peoples in accessing oral health care
- ◆ Understand aspects of native culture—language, beliefs, and expectations—that affect the indigenous dental experience and how to provide culturally competent care in your office
- ◆ Identify strategies to increase treatment plan acceptance among indigenous patients
- ◆ Access resources to expand knowledge of indigenous issues, proposed solutions to improve oral health and access to care, and contribute to a more equitable future

Ms. Moeller has lectured worldwide, was invited to speak at Grand Rounds at the Mayo Clinic, was invited to Stanford Sleep Residency program, and was the first myofunctional therapist to be on staff at the Pankey Institute. She currently teaches with the Palo Alto School of Sleep Medicine and taught for seven years at the UCLA dental sleep post-graduate program and the pedo-ortho residency. Ms. Moeller received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Academy of Physiologic Medicine and Dentistry, the Louis Pasteur Award from the Association of Applied Myofunctional Sciences in Rome in 2013 and the Richard Barrett Lifetime Achievement Award in 2023 from the IAOM.

The field of sleep medicine has exploded and now includes myofunctional therapy as an adjunctive treatment. Studies show that airway surgery such as tonsillectomy and adenoidectomy alone are not enough to reverse the effects of obstructive sleep apnea. A meta-analysis of 331 studies, which was accepted for publication in *Sleep*, concluded that myofunctional therapy decreases AHI by ~50% in adults and 62% in children. Lower oxygen saturations, snoring, and sleepiness outcomes improve in adults. This is changing the way medical professionals treat OSA. Since publication of that study in 2023, orthodontists can guide craniofacial growth depending on age; therefore, it is important to work with other providers for a team-based approach to sleep-disordered breathing which functional repatterning is now considered essential! With research linking treatment protocols to success as an adjunctive treatment to oral facial pain, early interceptive orthodontic treatment, post-orthodontic retention, periodontal therapy, and recognition and treatment of restricted frenum; health care workers may want to incorporate a systematic program into their practice. This course is an overview of the assessment, etiology, and treatment including some habit elimination therapy that a practitioner may implement into their practice.

- ◆ Understand why this therapy is important for prevention and treatment of sleep apnea, TMD, and orthodontic relapse

Over the next fifteen years the segment of the population at highest risk for medical emergencies, those 65 and older will become a larger percentage of our patients. This course will discuss the diagnosis, prevention, and management of common medical emergencies that might occur in dental offices. 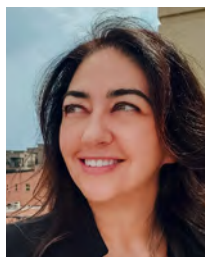

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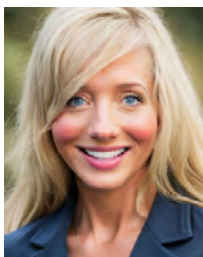

Endodontic treatment has evolved significantly from simple beginnings, and the success rate of this treatment has increased dramatically in the past decade or so, allowing clinicians to save teeth in a predictable and safe manner. Anatomically-oriented and conservative preparation of the root canal system is the best approach for long term success in endodontics. The anatomically centered approach, which will be proposed in this course, allows us to sacrifice less dentin, to enhance the irrigation process significantly, and to seal the root canal system with the best science has to offer today. Anatomically centered endodontics is not about a new instrument, equipment or products, but the combination of scientifically proven techniques and materials in one simple, biologically driven, and inexpensive workflow. The main purpose of this course is to help clinicians obtain long-term success in their endodontic cases without the need of complex, or expensive equipment, while providing the best possible care to their patients.

At the conclusion of this course, attendees will understand:

- ◆ The anatomically centered approach to root canal treatment
- ◆ How to achieve long term success utilizing a science-based, logical technique that preserves natural tooth structure

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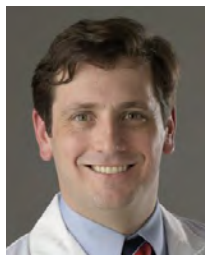
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**Jonathan Jelmini, DDS, MD**

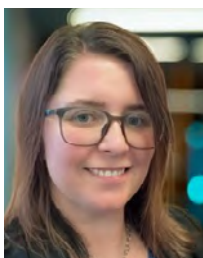

Oral and maxillofacial hard and soft tissue diseases encompass a wide range of pathologic conditions ranging from indolent and incidental to malignant that may carry substantial morbidity and mortality. Dental practitioners are most often the first providers to identify these problems for patients. Given the multitude of oral diseases and treatment options, developing an accurate assessment and carrying out clinical decisions may be overwhelming. The purpose of this talk is to develop an algorithmic approach to diagnosis, treatment and referrals for a broad differential of hard and soft tissue pathology of the mouth and jaws.

Advancements in medical/surgical treatment and pharmaceuticals have resulted in more patients with significant medical histories and extensive medication lists. This course focuses on several medically compromised disease states that dentists might encounter in daily practice that necessitate extra knowledge and care to prevent potential complications causing otherwise unnecessary morbidity and mortality. These include diabetes, multiple drug interactions, cardiac abnormalities, liver disease, kidney disease, just to name a few. Knowing the red flags will assist the dentist and their team before treatment is rendered on these patients. This course will also assist the dentist and their team on medical emergency preparedness through development of the 5R Emergency Response Plan, the CANAL acronym, and the foundation of medical emergency management. Everyone in the office—the dentist, the dental hygienist, the dental assistant, and even the nurses that work in the dental office—should be familiar with each drug within the drug kit, know each one's effects, and be comfortable with drawing up and labeling the drugs for administration. A thorough discussion of the emergency drug kit should take place during the monthly mock emergency drills performed by the dental office. Additionally, prepare documentation to use during a medical emergency that shows which drug was administered along with time, dosage and route; your records will be vitally important after the fact!
