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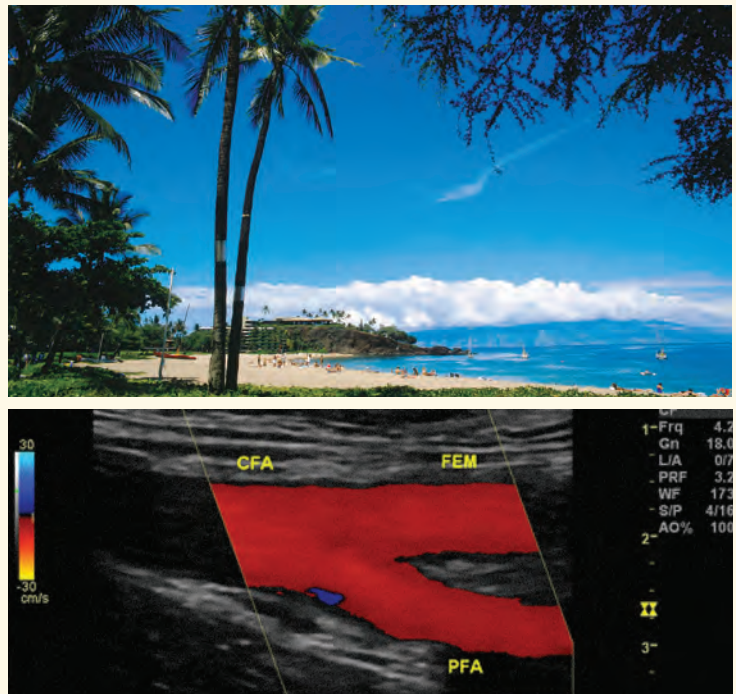

THURSDAY AFTERNOON VASCULAR LABORATORY INTERPRETATION

The vascular laboratory interpretation course on Thursday afternoon, available at an additional registration fee, provides a comprehensive review of interpretation criteria used in the vascular laboratory for cerebrovascular, venous, peripheral arterial, and visceral vascular examinations. Case-based presentations provide an engaging interactive format. Clinical examples are used to illustrate interpretation of typical cases from the vascular lab, as well as cases representing unusual clinical entities.

HISTORY AND BACKGROUND

Established in 1987 by Dr. D. Eugene Strandness, the “father of the vascular laboratory,” the biennial **Strandness Symposium** addresses diagnostic and therapeutic approaches to vascular disease. The symposium continues to emphasize the themes of Dr. Strandness’ life work and his continued legacy:

- Use of ultrasound and other non-invasive vascular tests in clinical practice, evaluation of the natural history of vascular diseases, and the rigorous scientific validation of new therapeutic approaches to vascular disease.
- Mentoring and professional development opportunities for those caring for the patient with vascular disease.
- Promoting effective inter-professional collaborations involving physicians, technologists, nurses, physician assistants, pharmacists, and others.

Vascular Care provides multi-disciplinary perspectives on the common problems and unusual challenges encountered in the care of patients with vascular diseases. The Program emphasizes “Total Vascular Care,” that the best outcomes result from the combination of technical excellence and comprehensive, patient focused care.

Vascular Care offers broad perspectives, addressing the novel and the state-of-the-art, as well as established “best practices” and evidence-based clinical guidelines. It also considers the continuum of care, emphasizing the benefits of incorporating complementary diagnostic tools, consideration of individual patients’ circumstances and needs, and long-term followup, including:

- Guidance on the best uses of endovascular therapeutics.
- Perspectives on established and innovative surgical techniques.
- Clinical practice guidelines and evidence-based treatment strategies.
- Interactive presentations of clinical case challenges.
- Tips and tricks for avoiding complications and managing the unexpected.

VASCULAR FORUM FOR STUDENTS, RESIDENTS AND FELLOWS

The Vascular Forum is a program designed to promote education and career development for trainees in fields related to the care of patients with vascular disease. First introduced with Vascular Care 2012, the Vascular Forum is open to medical students and post-graduate physicians, including residents and fellows in vascular surgery, radiology, and cardiology or vascular medicine. Because the Strandness Symposium & Vascular Care programs have traditionally supported inter-professional education and team-based care principles, trainees in nursing, allied health specialties, veterinary medicine, and other fields are welcome as participants in the Vascular Forum.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON VASCULAR FORUM PROGRAM

Trainees are invited to submit case studies, clinical research, or other topics related to the conference themes. Trainees with abstracts selected for presentation will compete for awards.

MONDAY AFTERNOON SKILLS TRAINING AND ASSESSMENTS

Residents and fellows will have one-on-one and small group instruction in vascular care technologies (non-CME).

MONDAY EVENING VASCULAR FORUM PROGRAM

While the content of this session targets the learning and professional development needs of the participating students, residents, and fellows, the session is open to all meeting attendees at an additional registration fee. The session will include didactic content and group discussion.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the activity, participants should be able to:

- Discuss the latest evidence-based consensus standards related to vascular care.
- Recognize common and uncommon clinical aspects of cerebrovascular disease.
- Use appropriate medical, interventional, or surgical treatment for common vascular pathologies.
- Identify innovations in vascular treatment that may reduce morbidity and improve outcomes.
- Use best practices in the vascular laboratory for diagnosis of cerebrovascular, venous, aortic, abdominal vascular, and peripheral artery disease.
- Diagnose vascular disease with radiographic, angiographic, and ultrasound imaging.
- Improve standards of care by implementing certification, credentialing, and accreditation standards.
- Discuss hot topics in vascular care, including information from recent scientific studies and current controversies in management.
- Use improved technical knowledge of vascular laboratory testing to expand scope and improve quality of non-invasive testing.
- Name the current requirements for interpretation and reporting of vascular laboratory tests.

CONFERENCE REGISTRATION

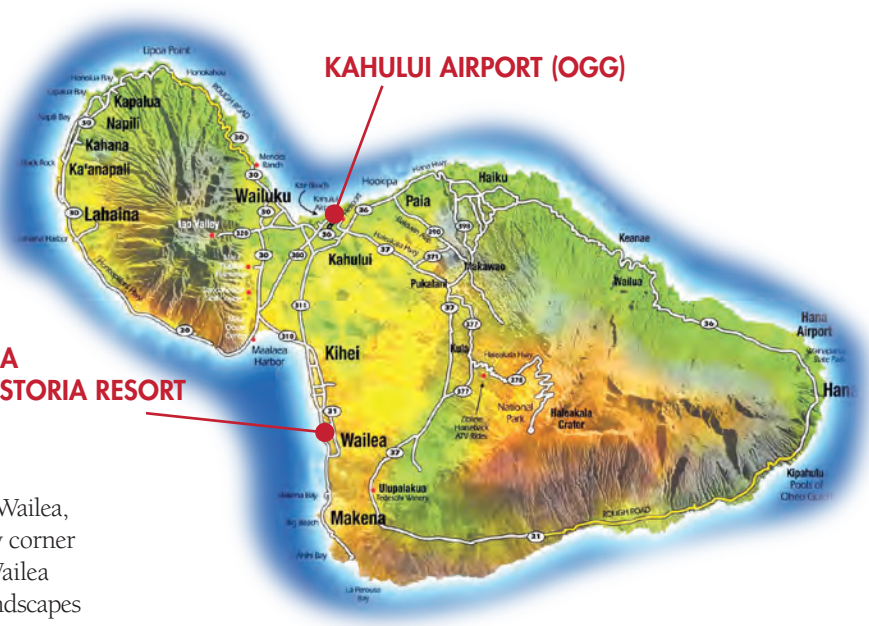
