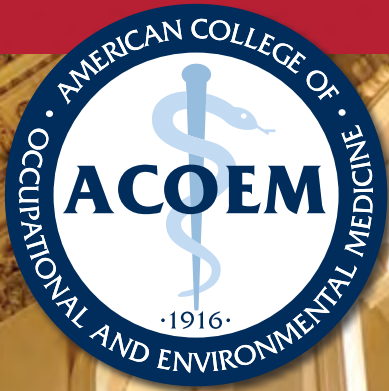

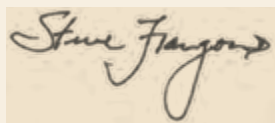

AOHC 2020

The 2020 American Occupational Health Conference (AOHC) is ACOEM's 105th Annual Meeting.

AOHC serves two fundamental purposes: 1) it is the premier professional meeting for physicians and related health professionals who have an interest in the fields of occupational and environmental medicine (OEM); and 2) it is the annual membership meeting for ACOEM's members.

Educational Needs and Objectives

ACOEM has identified core competencies in areas where the OEM-trained physician should strive to remain current and serve as a knowledgeable representative of the specialty. The 10 core competencies are available at acoem.org.

The ACOEM CME mission is to provide educational activities that enhance the professional capabilities related directly to the professional work of physicians practicing OEM and to: 1) promote physician lifelong and self-directed learning; 2) improve worker/patient clinical outcomes; 3) facilitate physician effectiveness and efficiency in carrying out professional responsibilities; and 4) communicate the value of OEM.

AOHC content is designed to enhance physician competence and performance and to improve patient outcomes by providing learner-centered education in the most current issues relevant to the practice of OEM.

Upon completion of AOHC 2020, the learner should be able to:

- evaluate current research;
- analyze emerging issues in OEM; and
- exemplify effectiveness and efficiency in carrying out professional responsibilities.

Target Audience

AOHC is designed for physicians who specialize in or have an interest in OEM as well as for non-physicians including nurse practitioners, physician assistants, industrial hygienists, certified occupational health nurses, safety professionals, and environmental health specialists. AOHC offers a variety of educational activities for participants new to OEM as well as for the experienced professional.

AOHC Poster Presentations and Display

AIRPORT OPTIONS

Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport (DCA)

The Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport is also referred to as Reagan National Airport, Washington National, or, more simply, Reagan Airport. It is approximately 6 miles from the Washington Hilton; about a 20-minute drive.

Dulles International Airport (IAD)

Dulles International Airport is typically referred to as Dulles Airport, Washington Dulles, or simply Dulles. It is approximately 27 miles from the Washington Hilton; about a 40-minute drive.

Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI)

Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport is also known as Baltimore Airport. It is approximately 33 miles from the Washington Hilton; about a 1-hour drive.

Cancellations/Changes

Cancellation requests must be received in writing by April 2, 2020. Notification by telephone will not be accepted. A refund will be issued minus an administrative fee of \$50. If you have registered for one or more courses, an additional \$95 fee will be assessed for each course syllabus (if already distributed; the syllabus is not returnable/refundable.) No refunds will be issued for cancellation requests received after April 2, 2020.

Pre-registration Deadline
