National roll-out of the metric is expected to start from 2019."

Achieving World-Class Cancer Outcomes: A Strategy for England 2015-2020, 2017

This national annual summit takes a practical approach to improving practice and outcomes for those living with and beyond cancer, moving from surviving to thriving. Through national updates and practical case studies the conference aims to support you to deliver on the above priorities outlined by NHS England and develop effective cancer survivorship support and services. There will be an extended focus on implementing the New National Quality of Life Metric for cancer survivors and learning from the pilots site. The metric is due to be rolled out nationally from 2019. The conference will also explore how we meet the unmet needs of people living with and beyond cancer, accelerating the roll-out of stratified follow up pathways and the commissioning of holistic packages of support, and ensuring every person with cancer will have access to relevant elements of the Recovery Package.
