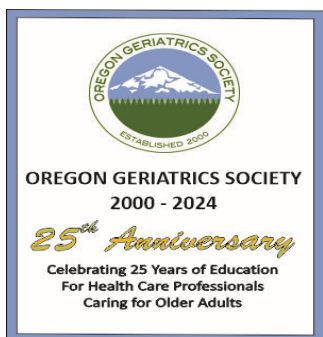

OBJECTIVES:

Define frailty in surgery population, understand its role as modifiable risk factor for postoperative complications, & identify 3 interventions to reduce risk. Learn treatment concepts for SUD. Appraise latest evidence in care for older adults. Describe cognitive profile of at least 2 different types of dementia. Understand physiology/pathophysiology of weight regulation & how is affected by aging. Describe how health literacy, unclear communication practices, & age intersect to produce healthcare inequities for older adults. Identify risk factors for & complications with atrial fibrillation. Discuss challenges & scenarios in home environments & explore creative solutions. Apply updated WHI data for women regarding risks & benefits of initiating or continuing menopausal hormone therapy. Learn reflective statements in motivational interviewing. Describe 3 conditions for reasonable medical evidence of cannabis use effectiveness. Learn complexities & multifaceted challenges of meds management across long-term care & during transitions of care. Learn evaluation of older driver & referral options for evaluation. Learn systematic way to approach barriers of transitions between hospital to skilled nursing home. Recognize SUD among older adults. Understand physiologic mechanisms driving Hyponatremic states & appropriate intervention, observation, & therapies. Understand population demographics, prevalence of CKD & burden of CKD/ESRD on health care system. Learn federal aging policy endeavors & advocacy efforts of caring for the older adult.
