SPEAKERS

George R. Deeb, DDS, MD, FACS



Dr. Deeb is a Professor in the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Virginia Commonwealth University School of Dentistry, where he serves as the Vice Chairman and Director of the Graduate and Undergraduate Dental Implant Programs. He earned his Doctor of Dental Surgery at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center and continued his education at Oregon Health Sciences University. Prior to joining VCU in 2013, Dr. Deeb practiced in Tucson, Arizona as a partner in a group surgery practice. Highly engaged in his profession, he has published over 40 peer reviewed articles and book chapters, and lectured at national and international meetings. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Fellow of the American College of Surgeons, and a Fellow in the Academy of Wilderness Medicine. In his spare time, he is an avid mountaineer and he enjoys glass casting and fusing.

Bone Grafting to Facilitate Implant Placement: Inadequate bone volume is a common finding in dental implant reconstruction. This lecture will review evidence-based procedures and minimally invasive approaches available to the oral and maxillofacial surgeon to perform sinus lifts procedures and horizontal ridge preservation and augmentation. **Sinus Lift Procedures:** Topics will include pt evaluation, CBCT interpretation, contraindications to treatment, traditional lateral window approach, crestal techniques, grafting materials and the role of biologics.

Ridge Augmentation: Topics will include "open" grafting, ridge expansion and horizontal ridge augmentation using particulate graft with GBR/tenting screws, tunneling techniques and bone cores/blocks. Case presentations and technique videos will include discussion of cone beam computed tomography anatomic considerations, the role of barriers and biologics as well as materials utilized for the procedures.

Janina Golob Deeb, DMD, MD



Dr. Golob Deeb received her dental degree from the University of Ljubljana, Slovenia in 1996. She continued her education at Oregon Health Sciences University. She received a certificate in Periodontology in 2000 and a Masters degree in Oral and Molecular Biology in 2001. She practiced in Vancouver, Washington and Arizona before moving to Richmond, Virginia in 2013, where she continued her career in academic dentistry at Virginia Commonwealth University School of Dentistry. She is director of Predoctoral Periodontics at VCU and works as clinical faculty in AEGD and undergraduate and graduate periodontal clinics. Dr. Golob Deeb is a board certified periodontist and holds licenses in Virginia, Arizona, Oregon and her native Slovenia. She continues to practice part-time in the Faculty intramural practice at the Virginia Commonwealth University. In her free time, she enjoys traveling and learning about different cultures and languages. She enjoys hiking and winter sports such as skiing.

Soft Tissue Grafting: The presence of healthy soft tissue surrounding implants is accomplished through careful planning and a variety of corrective grafting procedures. Materials of autogenous, allogenic and xenogenic sources are used to modify deficient soft tissue and can be performed during all stages of surgical or restorative therapy. The lecture will describe classifications of soft tissue defects, techniques and materials used for grafting to augment soft tissue, enhance esthetic outcomes and correct soft tissue deficiencies around implants.

Peri-Implantitis: Diagnosis and Treatment Options: Understanding the etiology, indications and treatment modalities for peri-implantitis to achieve optimal esthetics, function and maintenance of implants is an essential component of implant practice. The lecture will describe diagnosis and etiology of peri-implantitis and review treatment modalities and prognosis for implants affected by peri-implantitis.

Deepak Gopala Krishnan, DDS, FACS



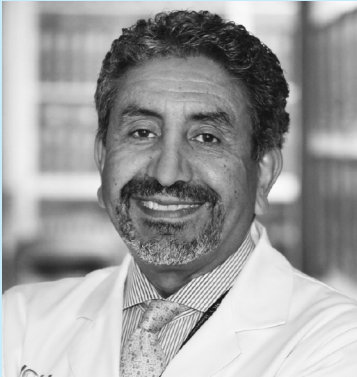
Dr. Krishnan is the chief of Oral Maxillofacial surgery at University of Cincinnati and at the Cincinnati Children's Hospital. He is a Professor of Surgery at the College of Medicine there, where he teaches and practices. Dr. Krishnan obtained his dental degree from Bangalore University and trained in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Emory University's College of Medicine in Atlanta. Upon completion of the residency, Deepak pursued further fellowship training in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery focusing on orthognathic surgery at Dalhousie University, Halifax, Canada. He currently serves on the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons Committee on Anesthesia and on the Committee of Education and Training. He is a director of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. He is the chief editor of Face to Face, the newsletter of the International Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons.

There is a Comet in the Sky: Ancient civilizations believed that appearance of a comet in the sky is an ominous sign of a imminent change. OMS practice patterns, demographics, social media periscopes, patients, scope of our practices and our anesthesia model among others are all aspects of our practice that are changing in front of our eyes. The battles that were priorities for the previous generation of OMSs seem to have lost priority in today's practice model. Where does OMS anesthesia team model fit into this? How are we adapting and evolving with the internal and external pressures on our proven effective efficient model? Are we poised to protect our model, or will we falter eventually? How does your own practice measure up to the expanded demands of today's office anesthesia practice?

AWARD WINNERS

Distinguished Educators Award: A. Omar Abubaker, DMD, PhD



A. Omar Abubaker, DMD, PhD is a graduate of the School of Dental Medicine, School of Dentistry, University of Pittsburgh. He also completed his residency training and a fellowship in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from Presbyterian University Hospital in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He has been on the Faculty at VCU School of Dentistry and VCU Medical Center since 1991. He is certified by the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.

Dr. Abubaker currently serves as Professor and Chairman of the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, VCU School of Dentistry; Chief of the Division of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Department of Surgery, VCU School of Medicine; and Chairman of the Department of Dentistry at VCUHealth. He maintains an busy private practice in oral and maxillofacial surgery and is actively involved in the teaching of dental and medical students and oral and maxillofacial surgery residents. Dr. Abubaker co-authored two oral and maxillofacial surgery textbooks, over 100 chapters and over 50 peer-review scientific articles and numerous abstracts and scientific presentations.

Dr. Abubaker is active in education in the areas of addiction, the opioid epidemic and pain management. In 2015, he earned a Graduate Certificate in Addiction Studies from the International Program in Addiction Studies jointly administered by Virginia Commonwealth University, The University of Adelaide, Australia and Kings College London, England.

He has presented to over 100 local, regional and national organizations on the topics of the opioid epidemic, addiction and postoperative pain management in dental and oral and facial settings and has appeared in many local and national media. He served on Virginia Governor Ralph Northam's Opioid Advisory Board as well as the U.S. Department of Justice's Central Virginia Overdose Working Group, and he has testified on this topic before the US Senate in Washington, DC.

During the past couple of years, Dr. Abubaker has extended his service by becoming the NIH/NIDCR Member of Data and Safety Monitoring Board (DSMB) for the study of more effective and safe methods of postoperative dental pain management. He also joined the Board of Directors of 2 End the Stigma, a non-profit organization with the purpose of providing education, guidance and resources to end the stigma associated with substance use disorder. He also serves on the Board of Directors of True Recovery United, a non-profit organization for providing outreach, support, education, guidance and resources to individuals struggling with substance use disorders.

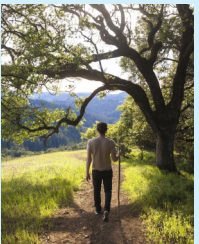
COMPLIMENTARY OXBOW DISTRICT SHOPPING

OUTPOST | *Close to O'Shaughnessy on Howell Mtn—great Zinfandel and Dan's favorite grenache. Award winning cabernets as well. Another outstanding view. Tell Bryan that you know us.*

DINING OUTSIDE OF THE RESORT

The following recommendations are from Kim Swanson and Dan Franks.

The French Laundry: *An almost impossible reservation & ridiculously expensive. It is also the best meal we have had in the U.S.*

Bouchon: *We never go to Napa without eating here. Like French Laundry it is a Thomas Keller restaurant, but much less formal. Very French, our very favorite dish is the potato puree, but the profiteroles are up there also.*

Don Giovanti: *South of Yountville—fun, boisterous, informal, Italian. Great pizza and traditional Italian favorites.*

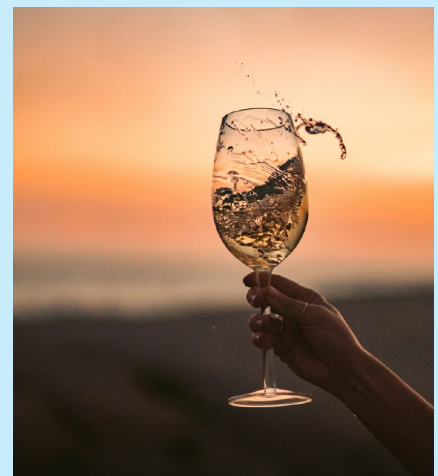
Angele-: *French country restaurant in the city of Napa with a great patio overlooking Napa River. Friendly & comfortable.*
