Cheryl Rosen, MD

Cheryl Rosen received her M.D. from the University of Toronto.

She did her residency in internal medicine and dermatology at the University of Toronto. Dr. Rosen then did a Clinical and Research Fellowship in photobiology at the Wellman Laboratories, Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard University.

Dr. Rosen is Head of the Division of Dermatology at Toronto Western Hospital, and University Health Network Hospitals. Dr. Rosen has a clinical practice at Toronto Western Hospital and is a Clinician Investigator with the Krembil Research Institute at TWH. She is a Professor in the Department of Medicine at the University of Toronto. Dr. Rosen continues to work with, teach and learn from the UofT dermatology residents, and residents and medical students from across Canada.

Dr. Rosen was the National Director of the Canadian Dermatology Association's Sun Awareness Program for many years and remains actively involved in the Sun Awareness Advisory Group. Dr. Rosen continues to be a member of the Ontario Sun Safety Working Group, after serving as the Chair for many years.

Dr. Rosen is also a member of GRAPPA (Group for Research and Assessment of Psoriasis and Psoriatic Arthritis) and IPART (International Psoriatic Arthritis Research Team) and IDEOM (International Dermatology Outcome Measures) Group.

Dr. Rosen's interests include:

- Public education for early detection and prevention of skin cancer
- Psoriasis and psoriatic arthritis
- Effects of ultraviolet radiation on cutaneous biology



Frederick Menick, MD

Frederick Menick, MD graduated from Yale University Medical School. Over 9 years, he completed general surgical training at Stanford University and the University of Arizona. He then specialized in Plastic Surgery at the University of California, Irvine. Advanced Fellowships in Plastic Surgery followed in England, California, and at the University of Miami under Dr. Ralph Millard M.D.

Dr. Menick is certified by the American Board of Plastic Surgery and is a member of the American Association of Plastic Surgeons, the American Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, the American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons, the Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons, and the Rhinoplasty Society (President 2006). He was the Visiting Professor for the American Society of Plastic Surgeons in 2012 and the Visiting Professor for the American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons in 2010.

Currently in private practice, Dr. Menick was Chief of Plastic Surgery (1991 — 1996) at the University of Arizona and Chief of Plastic Surgery (1985 — 1998) at the Tucson Veterans Administration Hospital. He is a Clinical Associate Professor in the Division of Plastic Surgery at the University of Arizona.

Dr. Menick has authored 3 textbooks on nasal and facial reconstruction, edited 3 books on facial cosmetic and reconstructive surgery, and published 42 book chapters and 50 peer-reviewed papers.

He was awarded the James Barrett Brown Prize in Plastic Surgery in 1989 and in 2002 for the most important paper published in the journals of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and the Annals of Plastic Surgery, won the Rubin Prize for the best presentation at the American Association of Plastic Surgeons, and was awarded the ASMs Special Honorary Award for his significant contributions for advancement of maxillofacial surgery and his leadership in the specialty in 2015 by the American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons. He lectures in United States and around the world.

During 15 overseas trips, he has performed charitable reconstructive surgery in Brazil, the Philippines, Korea, Africa, and Vietnam. Dr. Menick is included in The Best Doctors in America and Top Surgeons.

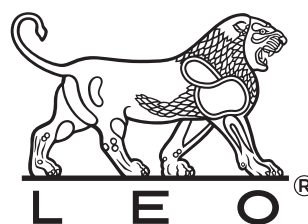
