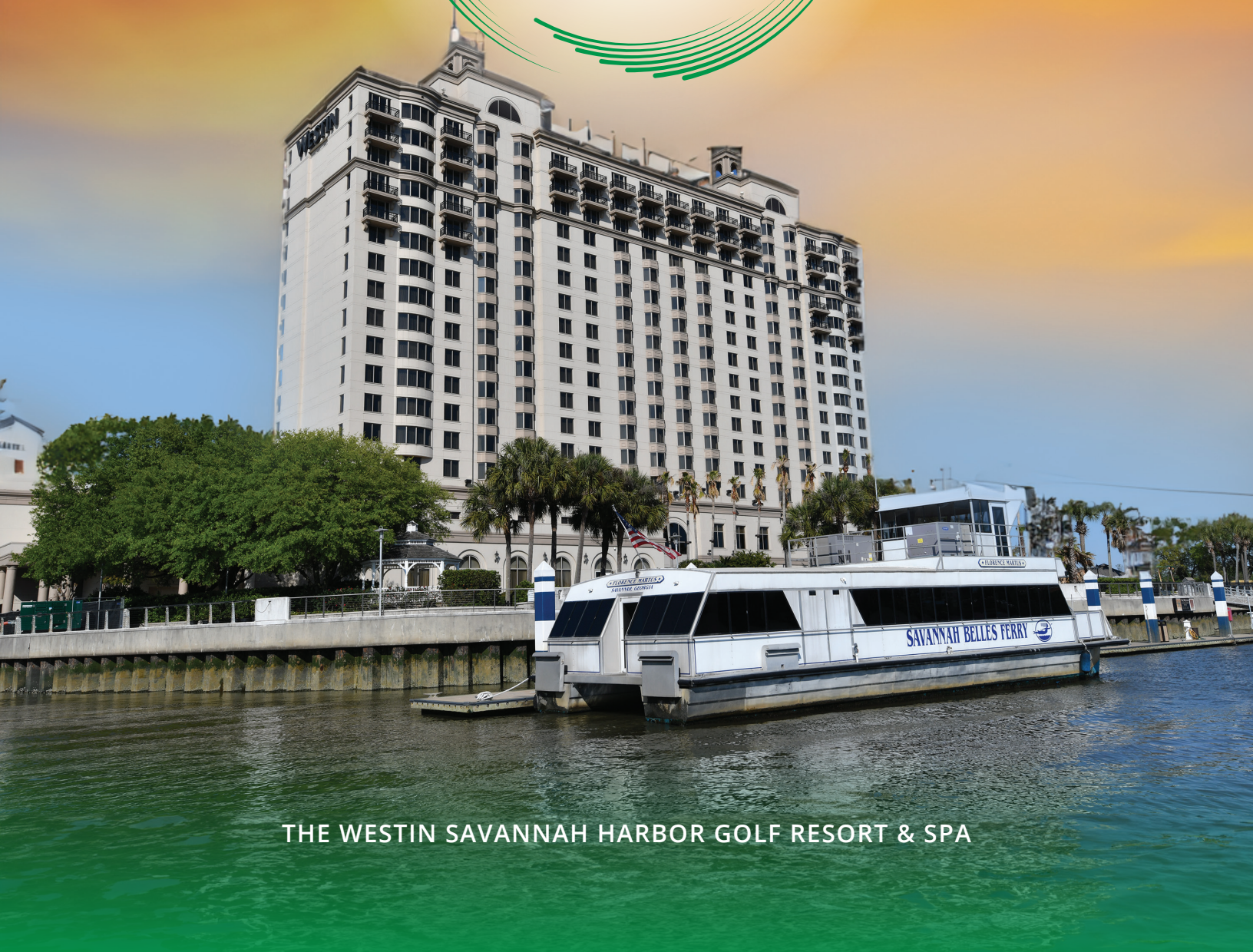

SAMIR BISHARA AWARD OF MERIT

The College Award of Merit, established in 2003, was renamed in 2011 after the death of Dr. Samir Bishara.

Egyptian born Dr. Bishara practiced dentistry in Egypt for 11 years, followed by a move to New York City, to work at the Guggenheim Clinic. He then moved to the University of Iowa, where he received his orthodontic degree for the second time. In 1968, Bishara became a faculty member in Iowa's Orthodontic Program, where he served until his death in 2010. He published over 200 articles and wrote Textbook of Orthodontics, in 2001. Dr. Bishara was a dedicated member of the College and Historian on the Council for over thirty years. His voice of reason, wisdom and ideas still resonate as College policy to this day, and it was an honor to add his name to the Award of Merit.

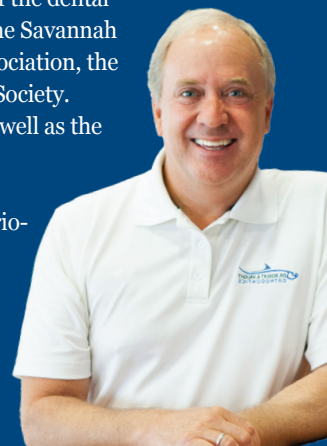
The 2023-24 Council is pleased to announce **Dr. Bob Vaught** as the recipient of the 2024 Samir Bishara Award of Merit.

Bob Vaught, a graduate of the University of South Carolina (undergraduate), Medical University of South Carolina (DMD) and Saint Louis University (MSD, valedictorian) is a long-time College member, joining in April of 1999, after becoming board-certified earlier that year. He joined the Council in 2015 and served as President of the College during the 2020-21 year.

Active in many dental organizations, his commitment to the future of the dental profession and orthodontics are significant. He has been involved with the Savannah Dental Society, Georgia Association of Orthodontics, Georgia Dental Association, the Georgia Dental Insurance Service, and the Southeastern District Dental Society. He has held roles in the Southern Association of Orthodontists (SAO) as well as the American Association of Orthodontists.

His most recent "Step Beyond" was serving on the committee tasked with fully adapting the College Prep Course for the then-new ABO scenario-based clinical exam, which later went to a virtual exam format in 2021. Bob continued to be part of the instructor team for numerous courses.

Bob and Kathy are parents of three- Kate (Dr. Kate Vaught- in practice with her Dad), Robert and Will. He is an avid outdoorsman, with hunting and saltwater fly fishing being tops on the priority list.

Scientific Lectures

Saturday, March 9



Hugo De Clerck, DDS

Hugo De Clerck is a graduate of the Ghent University Orthodontic Program. He received his PhD in 1986, and he maintains a private practice in Brussels. He has been Professor and Chairperson of the Department of Orthodontics at the Université Catholique de Louvain from 1989 to 2006. Currently he's an Adjunct Professor at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He received the Dewel Award in 2012 from the American Journal of Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopedics. In 2019 he received the Jacob A. Salzmänn Award from the American Association of Orthodontists, and the John Valentine Merzhon Memorial Award in 2022. He's a former President of the Belgian Orthodontic Society and Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England. His main research interests are in skeletal anchorage, biomechanics and orthopedics. He has lectured extensively on these topics throughout the world.

True Mandibular Lengthening by a Bone Anchored Herbst appliance

The chin grows forward by 3 basic mechanisms. The most important one is an increase in mandibular length. To a lesser degree the glenoid fossa can remodel such that it and the condyles undergo small relocations. Finally, mandibular rotation may occur with anterior mandibular rotation increasing chin projection, and posterior rotation decreasing chin projection. Treatment by a conventional Herbst appliance only results in a small gain in forward chin projection. This may be explained by the proclination of lower incisors.

Objectives:

- To be able to improve the outcome of class II orthopedics
- To be able to understand mandibular growth changes by a bone anchored Herbst appliance
- To be able to use CBCT images to explain mandibular growth changes by class II orthopedics
- To be able to quantify true mandibular lengthening and true mandibular rotation

**Ashok Kothari, DMD, MSD**

Dr. Ashok Kothari is an educator and a clinician who has lectured nationally and internationally on various topics. Dr. Kothari completed his dental and orthodontic training from Bombay University, India in 1975 and 1978 respectively. He obtained a Certificate in Oral Biology after completing

Orthodontic residency from Loyola University Chicago in 1983.

Dr. Kothari practices with his daughter, Anuja, in their Joliet and Countryside offices in the Chicago suburbs.

He was a Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago. He has published articles on clinical orthodontics in various journals, including the World Journal of Orthodontics and the Journal of Clinical Orthodontics.

Management of Complex Cases and Interdisciplinary Treatment

During this program, the role of the orthodontist in comprehensive treatment planning and sequencing of treatment will be covered.

The role of orthodontic tooth movement to enhance restorative and periodontal objectives will be discussed.

Objectives:

- Concept of planning and treating complex malocclusions
- Timing and sequencing of treatment
- Orthodontic procedures that enhance esthetic, periodontal and restorative treatment for comprehensive care
- Orthognathic team management of patients with skeletal discrepancies

Sunday, March 10

**Frank Celenza, Jr., DDS**

Dr. Frank Celenza is a second generation dentist. His father was an internationally acclaimed teacher, author and speaker in the field of Prosthodontics. Dr. Celenza Jr. is dual-certified in the specialties of both Orthodontics and Periodontics.

This dual specialty uniquely positions him to a deeper appreciation and understanding of the adult dentition, from treatment planning through treatment execution. He has been involved in post-graduate teaching for over 20 years at institutions such as New York University, and currently at Rutgers University, NJ. He is widely published in the dental literature and has written six textbook chapters. He is an acclaimed speaker at major dental conferences both domestically and internationally. Dr. Celenza has pioneered techniques and innovations in his field and his work combining implant dentistry with orthodontics was ground-breaking.

Ortho/Perio in the Aligner Age

Certain orthodontic movements are utilized for their beneficial impact upon the periodontium. These movements include forced eruption, molar uprighting, embrasure management, root torqueing, and implant interactions. Historically, these movements were accomplished primarily by employing fixed appliance mechanotherapy. However, the advent and development of aligner therapy has developed to a level of sophistication that now allows these

movements to be accomplished utilizing removable aligner techniques. This presentation will delineate the philosophy behind these movements, the periodontal benefit, and display clinical cases that illustrate these methods.

Objectives:

- Participants will develop an appreciation for the periodontal aspects of certain tooth movements
- Participants will develop an appreciation for physiology of tooth movement
- Participants will gain an understanding of aligner mechanotherapy
- Participants will gain an exposure to interdisciplinary management of clinical situations

**Roger Wise, DDS**

Dr. Wise received his Doctor of Dental Surgery degree from Emory University in 1971. He went on to obtain his Certificate in Periodontics from Boston University in 1973, and then completed his Certificate in Orthodontics in 1977, also at Boston University. He is a Diplomate of the American

Board of Periodontology.

Dr. Wise is a past faculty member and lecturer in the Departments of Orthodontics and Periodontics at Harvard School of Dental Medicine, from 1993 to 2010. He currently lectures in the Departments of Periodontics and Prosthodontics at Harvard University. He has presented more than 200 lectures in the US and throughout the world on the interrelationship between Adult Orthodontics, Periodontics, and Restorative Dentistry. He has also written five textbook chapters and has authored numerous papers in peer-reviewed journals. He is one of the small number of periodontists in the world fully trained in both Periodontics and Orthodontics.

In addition to his private practice focus on Periodontics, Implantology, and Orthodontics, Dr. Wise served 15 years as a consultant for the American Journal of Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopedics.

Treatment of The Periodontally Compromised Adult Orthodontic Patient Utilizing Innovative and Effective Team Collaboration

The orthodontic profession has only recently focused its attention on adult patient-driven diagnosis and treatment planning. It is difficult to imagine practicing dentistry today without the utilization of orthodontics, as smile esthetics can be very challenging or even compromised. In problem-oriented treatment planning, the orthodontist may help establish a diagnosis that identifies possible improvement or even correction of hard and soft tissue. This lecture will also demonstrate how to establish occlusal and/or spatial relationships prior to implant placement.

Objectives:

- Learn how to utilize simple cosmetic problem-based orthodontics in an adult to avoid periodontal liabilities.
- Careful diagnosis of gingival abnormalities as to whether they will alter the timing of orthodontics in an adult.
- Three dimensional osseous evaluation pre and post treatment via CBCT in an adult.
- Determine in the adult if the pre-treatment malocclusion may be more stable than after orthodontic revision.



Pradip Shetye, DDS

Dr. Shetye is a Board-Certified Orthodontist and has an appointment as Associate Professor of Plastic Surgery (Craniofacial Orthodontics), Director of Craniofacial Orthodontics, and Craniofacial Orthodontics Fellowship at New York University Langone Medical Center. He is

also appointed as Clinical Associate Professor of Orthodontics at NYU College of Dentistry.

Dr. Shetye is an internationally recognized orthodontist and has co-edited a book titled Cleft and Craniofacial Orthodontics. He has authored over 100 peer-reviewed scientific papers and 35 book chapters. He has given over 200 scientific presentations at various universities, national and international scientific meetings in over 20 countries. Dr. Shetye has received several awards for clinical excellence.

Orthodontic Management of Cleft Patients from Birth to Adult

Orthodontic treatment of patients born with cleft is a long and complex process and frequently extends from birth into late teens and early adulthood. The orthodontic care is best provided in collaboration with an interdisciplinary team that includes plastic surgery, speech language pathology, otolaryngology, psychology, and other allied health disciplines. This presentation will focus on orthodontic management for patients born with cleft during infancy, preschool, pre-adolescence, adolescence, and adulthood.

Objectives:

- Appreciate the role of an Orthodontist on an interdisciplinary cleft team
- Understand the sequencing and timing of orthodontic treatment and surgery
- Comprehend the goals of orthodontic interventions at different stages of growth

Sebastian Baumgaertel, DMD, MSD

Dr. Baumgaertel is a Clinical Associate Professor at Case Western Reserve University and a Visiting Professor at the University of Melbourne. He has lectured nationally and internationally on orthodontic mini-implants, Cone Beam Computed Tomography and the

Invisalign™ appliance. He has published multiple scientific articles and is co-editor and author of two text books and various book chapters. He serves as a member of the editorial review board of the American Journal of Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopedics and other highly respected journals. Aside from devoting his time to research and education, Dr. Baumgaertel maintains an active private practice in the Cleveland, OH area where he cares for patients of all ages.

Treatment of Three Tough Orthodontic Problems with TADs

TADs are more popular than ever and have become a staple of modern orthodontics, probably because they help solve some difficult orthodontic problems frequently with less patient compliance and lower invasiveness. In this fast paced lecture Dr. Baumgaertel will discuss three tough but common orthodontic problems where TADs have proved to be a game changer in his practice.

Objectives:

- Learn a time tested approach to molar protraction through edentulous sites with the help of TADs
- Understand how to correct anterior open bites with TAD supported maxillary molar intrusion
- Use TADs for lower arch retraction in cases with class III malocclusions



Katie Klein, DMD, MS

Katie Klein, DMD, MS is a board-certified orthodontic specialist and an Assistant Professor of Developmental Biology in the Department of Developmental Biology at the Harvard School of Dental Medicine (HSDM). A graduate of the University of

Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine, she completed an Advanced Education in General Dentistry program and served as a dentist in the U.S. Air Force. Dr. Klein then obtained her Master of Science in Oral Biology and Certificate in Orthodontics from the University of North Carolina – Chapel Hill. She is currently the Course Director of the Surgical Orthodontics Course for second year orthodontic residents at HSDM, and is the owner of Katie Klein Orthodontics, a private practice just outside of Boston, Massachusetts.

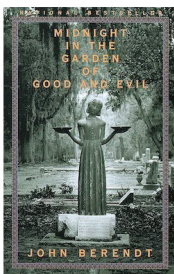

2024 Ladies Book Club Selection *Midnight in the Garden of Good & Evil*

Shots rang out in Savannah's grandest mansion in the misty, early morning hours of May 2, 1981. Was it murder or self-defense? For nearly a decade, the shooting and its aftermath reverberated throughout this hauntingly beautiful city of moss-hung oaks and shaded squares.

John Berendt's 1994 sharply observed, suspenseful, and witty narrative reads like a thoroughly engrossing novel, and yet it is a work of nonfiction. Berendt skillfully interweaves a hugely entertaining first-person account of life in this isolated remnant of the Old South with the unpredictable twists and turns of a landmark murder case.

The book spent 216 weeks as a New York Times Best-seller and remains one of the longest best-sellers. The book won the 1995 Boeke Prize and was one of the non-fiction finalists for the 1995 Pulitzer Prize.

Private CDABO Trolley Sightseeing Tour

Founded in 1733, Savannah is one of America's finest preserved cities and considered a jewel of the south. CDABO will enjoy a comprehensive, completely narrated guided tour of one of the largest National Urban Historic Land marked Districts in the United States.

You will travel through more than 280 years of American history. Ride along cobblestone paved streets beneath moss-draped oaks and experience the "Old South" with her stately mansions, beautiful squares, romantic riverfront and abundance of true southern charm.

We will enjoy two stops during this tour:

- **Cathedral Basilica of St. John the Baptist.** After the first Parish establishment in the late 1700s; the April 1, 1839 dedication of the 1000-seat Church of Saint John the Baptist; the 1876 dedication of the new French Gothic style Cathedral; the 1898 fire and 1912 completion of the redecoration, the Cathedral Basilica was consecrated, upon retiring its debt in 1920. 100 years later, His Holiness Pope Francis issued a decree naming the Cathedral a Minor Basilica. Minor basilicas are traditionally named because of their antiquity, dignity, historical value, architectural and artistic worth, and significance as centers of worship. Nationwide, there are just 87 churches, including 18 cathedrals who hold carry such distinction.

- **Forsyth Park**, the largest, at 30-acres, in the Savannah historic district. Formerly known at Military Parade Ground, it contains walking paths, a play area for children, a Fragrant Garden for those who have limited or no sight, basketball and tennis courts, soccer and frisbee areas, the home field for the Savannah Shamrocks Rugby Club, the Civil War Memorial and *The Hiker* statue representing American soldiers who fought in the Spanish-American War. The "star" of Forsyth Park is its fountain, which has appeared in Hollywood films such as *Cape Fear*, *The Longest Yard*, *Forrest Gump* and *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil*.

We will take a trolley tour group photo, at the fountain, especially festive in anticipation of the following week's 200th anniversary of Savannah's St. Patrick's Day parade.

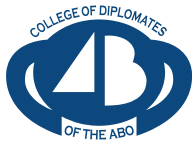
