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In February 2016 the definition of sepsis was revised to **“Sepsis is defined as life-threatening organ dysfunction caused by a dysregulated host response to infection”**

The new definition **“emphasizes the primacy of the nonhomeostatic host response to infection, the potential lethality that is considerably in excess of a straightforward infection, and the need for urgent recognition. As described later, even a modest degree of organ dysfunction when infection is first suspected is associated with an in-hospital mortality in excess of 10%. Recognition of this condition thus merits a prompt and appropriate response.”** The Third International Consensus Definitions for Sepsis and Septic Shock, February 2016

“Over 123,000 people in England suffered from sepsis last year and it is estimated to kill around 37,000 people each year. Although treatable in many cases, sepsis can be difficult to recognise and diagnose. It is a significant cause of avoidable death.” NICE, January 2016

In January 2016 NICE published a new draft guideline ‘Sepsis: the recognition, diagnosis and management of severe sepsis’ the guidelines are due to be published in July 2016. The guideline will help healthcare professionals working in any NHS setting to recognise sepsis so they can provide early treatment.

The draft recommendations, which have been published for public consultation, cover the recognition, diagnosis and early management of sepsis, include:

- What signs and symptoms to look out for, how to identify those at high risk of developing sepsis and which clinical tests to use to diagnose and monitor.
- How to care for people with suspected sepsis outside of hospital and when they should be referred for emergency care.
- Appropriate use of antibiotics and other supportive treatments such as fluids and oxygen.
- The type of information which should be given to people with sepsis as well their families and carers

NICE, January 2016

This Masterclass will explore evidence behind interventions, barriers to reliable delivery and solutions in the context of the Surviving Sepsis Campaign guidelines and the draft NICE recommendations.

The roles of individual health professionals within acute hospitals, the community and the prehospital environment will be explored to aid understanding and planning of a system-wide response. The day will also outline national and global strategies to embed sepsis as a clinical priority for health systems.

The facilitator for the masterclass is Dr Ron Daniels. Ron Daniels is a full time NHS Consultant in Intensive Care and Anaesthesia, based in Birmingham. He's also Chief Executive of the UK Sepsis Trust and the Global Sepsis Alliance. In 2016 he was awarded the British Empire Medal for services to patients.

Ron is Chief Executive of the Global Sepsis Alliance, having been instrumental in bringing World Sepsis Day and the Chairman's concept of the World Sepsis Declaration to fruition. He is Chief Executive of the United Kingdom Sepsis Trust, a registered charity, in which capacity he provides in addition to public duties clinical advice to NHS England, the Department of Health and to the Parliamentary and Health Service Ombudsman. He has lobbied the United Kingdom Government, together with devolved governments in Scotland and Wales, over several years culminating in an announcement by the Secretary of State for Health of a resourced suite of measures to transform sepsis care across the UK. Ron and his team developed both the 'Sepsis Six' care bundle, now in use in 12 countries, and the clinical concept of 'Red Flag Sepsis'. Both are endorsed and recommended by the UK Royal Colleges and by NHS England.
