

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course will provide practical approaches to common problems in Hospital Medicine informed by experts and the latest evidence.

TARGET AUDIENCE

The target audience is comprised of physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and nurses practicing Hospital Medicine. Some of the clinicians will also be engaged in education, research, quality improvement, and management. The audience may also include Hospital Medicine program administrators, resident physicians, and medical students with an interest in careers in Hospital Medicine.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

By the end of the event, participants should be able to:

- Identify new guidelines for management of critically ill patients
- Better understand the management of hospitalized transplant patients
- Recognize how Hospitalists add value to the care of hospitalized patients

WORKSHOP INFORMATION

A. Point of Care Ultrasound Workshop **(SimLab on the UVM Campus)*
Point-of-care ultrasound has emerged as an important bedside tool in the management of acutely ill patients. This workshop combines high-yield didactic sessions with hands-on training on live models. The workshop starts with a review of ultrasound technology basics and then explores a myriad of diagnostic ultrasound applications: focused cardiac ultrasound, pleural effusions, pneumothorax, ascites and lower extremity deep venous thrombosis. The workshop is ideal for both beginners and those looking to refine their ultrasound skills. Expected faculty to attendee ratio is 1:3.

**Please note that this workshop will occur at the UVM Campus in Burlington, VT, approximately 45 minutes by car from the Stoweflake.*

B. Physical Exam Skills Workshop *(at Stoweflake)*
The bedside physical examination is an essential component of excellent patient care. Physical examination findings add diagnostic data that enhance clinical reasoning at the bedside and help providers select high value studies. In addition, the physical exam itself can help foster trust between clinicians and patients. This workshop will help providers refresh their physical examination skill set, understand the evidence behind various physical exam findings, and effectively collaborate with patients despite the challenges posed by the fast pace of inpatient medical care. The course will include case-based and hands-on learning that will demonstrate how the physical examination improves care delivery and is the foundation of the provider-patient relationship.

C. Every Interaction Matters: Communication Skills Workshop for Hospitalists *(at Stoweflake)*
Over the course of a Hospital Medicine career, you will have between 150,000 and 200,000 patient and family interactions. Communication skills training teaches clinicians how to use each of these interactions as an opportunity to provide patient-centered care, has been shown to improve professional fulfillment, and can be an important tool to prevent burnout. This highly interactive workshop will use active learning strategies, such as role playing, simulation, and focused reflection on a background of real clinical scenarios to enhance your communication skills and subsequently improve patient care and job satisfaction.
