Overview

This seminar in diagnostic surgical pathology and immunohistochemistry (IHC) will allow practicing anatomic pathologists to become proficient in the application of diagnostic IHC in different subspecialties and to recognize newly described entities in different organs and how to work up a diagnostic challenging case. It features didactic lectures and case-based presentations by Geisinger faculty and four international experts in the field of anatomic pathology and IHC: Drs. John Hart, Philip Cagle, Andrew Folpe and Jonathan Epstein. It will address frequently asked questions that practicing pathologists encounter in day-to-day practice and help residents and fellows with their specialty board exam preparations.
