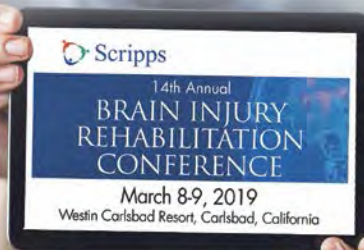
Conference Course Materials
