"The first nursing associate programmes started in January 2017, and we expect the first nursing associates to qualify in early 2019. The student nursing associates on the pilot programmes are training according to a framework developed by HEE, which was informed by a public consultation on the role. They will need to meet the NMC's nursing associate standards of proficiency to qualify as nursing associates and apply to join the register. The Government has determined that statutory regulation of the nursing associate profession is required to protect the public. In January 2017, our Council agreed to the Department of Health and Social Care's request to regulate nursing associates in England."

Through national updates, case studies from the Nursing Associate test sites, and perspectives from Nursing Associate Trainees the conference will look at the developing role, the Nursing Associate Curriculum, regulation of the role, accountability, competence and how you can prepare for the introduction of the role in practice. A limited number of free places will be offered to trainee nursing associates, and discounts are available for staff from the lead test sites.

A presentation from Prof David Sines, Chair of the Medicines Management Group Advisory Guidance will advise delegates on expectations for nursing associates who administer medicines to patients and ensuring adequate levels of supervision are in place.
