The otolaryngologist and the speech language pathologist must maintain this knowledge base with continued review and learning. The 2019 UCLA Laryngology Update will provide a wide range of laryngology learning topics with a unique approach of presenting the learning within clinical presentations. These clinical vignettes will provide direct correlation to current practice patterns and experience. Working toward the diagnostic and treatment goals of each case will offer an exciting and productive learning opportunity for the experienced and novice otolaryngologist (ENT) and speech language pathologist (SLP) alike.

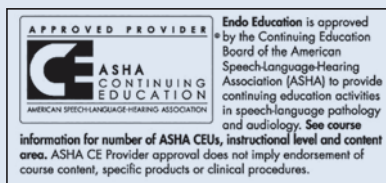
