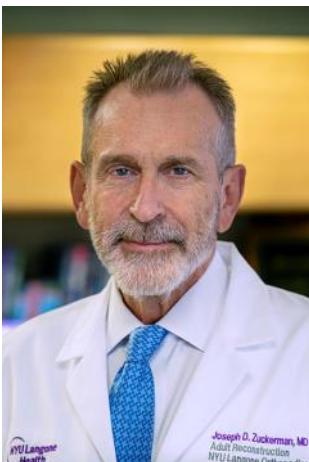

KEYNOTE SPEAKER



JOSEPH ZUCKERMAN, M.D.

Joseph Zuckerman, M.D., is the Walter A. L. Thompson Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery at the NYU School of Medicine (SOM) and Chairman of the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at NYU Hospital for Joint Diseases (HJD). He is an internationally recognized expert in shoulder surgery and hip and knee replacement. He established the Hip Fracture Research Group and the Shoulder Research Group and helped design a shoulder replacement system for the treatment of glenohumeral arthritis and shoulder fractures. In addition to Dr. Zuckerman's educational, research and administrative responsibilities, he maintains an active clinical practice specializing in shoulder surgery and hip and knee replacements, performing over 280 operative procedures each year.

Dr. Joseph Zuckerman will share his unique insights on the value of evolving research in orthopaedic surgery. And why committing to the mentorship of young surgeons matters more now than ever before.
