PARALLEL SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

MOC Self-Assessment: Pediatric Dermatology

Katherine Puttgen, MD, Johns Hopkins University

This session is geared specifically for those enrolled in MOC-D. It features short case studies that relate to the diagnosis, treatment and management of pediatric dermatology conditions. Submission Deadline: Tuesday, May 3, 2016

Attendees are invited to submit case summaries and poster abstracts for review and selection to be presented during SPD's 42nd Annual Meeting. There are three categories:

CASES OF THE YEAR

Moderator: Amy Jo Nopper, MD, Children's Mercy Hospital

Cases of the Year includes cases with a known diagnosis, diseases that were difficult to diagnose, or cases presenting management challenges. These cases should have attendant teaching value. Case presentations are four minutes, with an additional two-minute question & answer period. Twenty cases will be selected for the Annual Meeting.

Please note that if a submitted case is chosen to be presented as one of SPD's Cases of the Year, it will not be simultaneously assigned a poster space. Submitted cases not chosen for a Cases of the Year oral presentation may be presented as a poster; however, SPD will give preferred assignment of space to research-oriented work.

JUNIOR FACULTY & FELLOWS FORUM

Moderator: John Browning, MD, Baylor College of Medicine

This category includes basic science or clinical research projects which may include case series of clinical interest with accompanying literature reviews, which may have been conceived and/or conducted by pediatric dermatology fellows and/or junior faculty who have been out of training for five years or less. Three submissions will be chosen for presentation at the Annual Meeting.

POSTER PRESENTATIONS

Research studies should be submitted as poster presentations. Case reports should be submitted as Cases of the Year, not posters, if appropriate. Poster presenters should be available during coffee breaks for discussion. Approximately 40 posters will be selected for presentation during the conference, each on a four-foot tall by eight-foot wide board. Awards will be presented for the best posters. 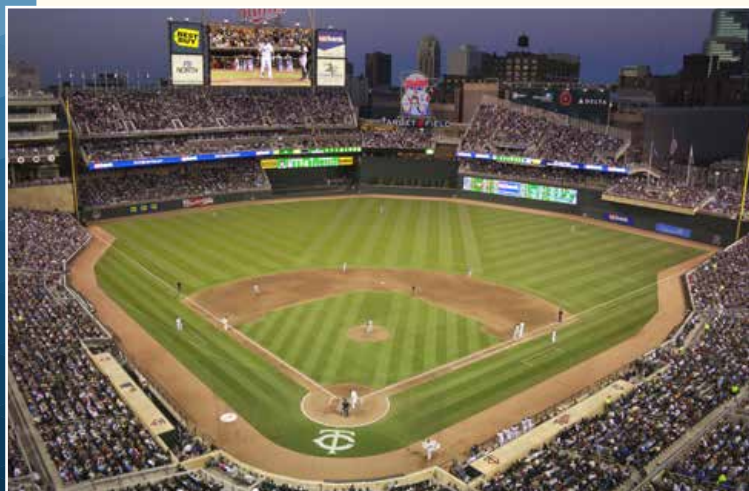
MEET THE PROFESSOR BREAKFAST

James J. Hill House and Historic Summit Avenue Walking Tour

Explore St. Paul's history by visiting the grand home of James J. Hill — railroad baron, entrepreneur, philanthropist, and art collector. Completed in 1891, with 36,000 square feet and 42 rooms, the mansion was the largest and most expensive home in Minnesota. In addition to touring the home, you'll explore the architecture, social history and preservation of one of America's grand boulevards on a guided walking tour of Summit Avenue.

Kayaking on the Mississippi

This urban kayaking experience explores the industrial heritage of Minneapolis from the perspective of the river that made Minneapolis life possible. The tour explores the river above St. Anthony Falls up to the Broadway Avenue Bridge and delves into the industrial history of the city from the unique and beautiful perspective of the river. Participants gain a new perspective on today's city by viewing the historical importance of the river from kayaks as they glide past and investigate important landmarks on Nicollet Island, Boom Island, and near the Grain Belt Brewery.

TRAVEL AWARDS

Travel awards are available on a competitive basis to fellows, residents, and medical students who are SPD members and present cases (Cases of the Year) or posters at the SPD Annual Meeting. This is an effort to encourage participation among trainees interested in pediatric dermatology and helps provide recognition for exceptional work as well as financial assistance to attend the meeting. There will be two \$1,000 awards available for the SPD 2016 Annual Meeting. Members who qualify will apply through the SPD website at the time of submission of cases and posters. The SPD Awards and Goals Committee will evaluate the quality of the case/poster, focusing on whether it presents "new" information, is relevant to care of children with skin diseases, quality of data, and approved consent process.

The AAP Section on Dermatology will offer one \$1,000 Travel Award, open to residents or fellows who present cases or posters at the Annual Meeting. Preference will be given to abstracts that focus on pediatric dermatology education, workforce, Medical Home, and collaborating with pediatrician partners. Members can apply for this award through the SPD website at the time of case or abstract submission.
