Realizing True Health Equity- An Equal Opportunity To Be Healthy For All

The third Principle of Medical Ethics states "a physician shall respect the law and also recognize a responsibility to seek changes in those requirements which are contrary

to the best interests of the patient." This presentation will posit that inequality, and the laws that ensure inequality are the number one threat to patient health and well-being in America. Therefore, this presentation will argue that the most unappreciated responsibility of physicians is to participate in eradicating inequality under the law. The evidence to support this position will include morbidity and mortality data from the deadly SARS-CoV-2 virus as well as our national track record for limiting its spread to date. These data demonstrate how important, even indispensable physicians and all members of the health professions are to realizing true health equity in our country.

About Dayna Bowen Matthew, JD, PhD:

A nationally recognized lawyer and legal scholar with three decades of industry and academic experience, Dean Matthew is the first woman to lead GW Law. An expert in health equity and public health policy with a passion for public service, Dean Matthew previously served as the University of Virginia Law School's William L. Matheson and Robert M. Morgenthau Distinguished Professor of Law and the F. Palmer Weber Research Professor of Civil Liberties and Human Rights. She was also a professor of public health sciences at the UVA School of Medicine and served as director of the Equity Center at UVA, which works to build relationships between the university and its surrounding community to address racial and socioeconomic inequality. Prior to her tenure at UVA, she served as professor of law, vice dean and associate dean of academic affairs at the University of Colorado Law School and, before that, as professor of law and medicine at the University of Kentucky College of Law.

It's Never Too Early to Become an Agent for Change

In this presentation Lash Nolen—the first Black woman to become student council president at Harvard Medical School, will draw on her experiences as a student leader to demonstrate the ways health professionals

can create meaningful change for our communities through intentional leadership, social media, writing, and community activism.

About LaShyra "Lash" Nolen:

LaShyra "Lash" Nolen is a Los Angeles native deeply passionate about the concerns of underserved and marginalized communities. She graduated with honors from Loyola Marymount University in 2017 with a B.S. in Health and Human Sciences. She then spent two gap years before starting medical school, the first as a Fulbright Scholar in Spain and the second as an AmeriCorps health educator in Chicago. Currently, she is a second-year student at Harvard Medical School where she is serving as student council president of her class, the first documented black woman to hold this leadership position. She is a published author and fervent advocate for social justice whose commentary has been published in the Boston Globe, New England Journal of Medicine, and HuffPost, among others. Lash is also a Foster Scholar in Health Policy, Advocacy, and Media at the MGH Stoeckle Center for Primary Care Innovation and a co-host for the Clinical Problem Solvers Anti-Racism in Medicine podcast. Her work has earned her the honor of becoming the 2020 National Minority Quality Forum's youngest "40 under 40 Leader in Minority Health" and named a "2020 Young Futurist" by *The Root Magazine*. In the future she plans to pursue a Masters in Public Policy along with her medical degree to advocate for humane healthcare reform as a physician activist on national and international scales.

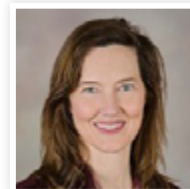
