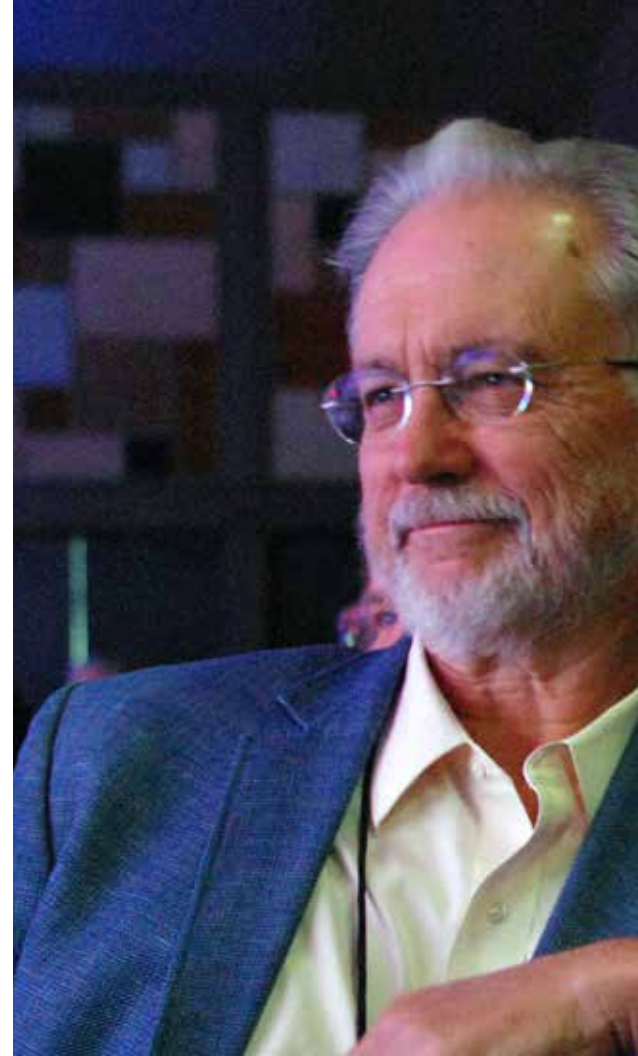

SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

Plenary sessions bring all attendees together for a shared learning experience designed to stimulate new thinking and conversation.

Workshops are half- or full-day preconference sessions that typically require an additional registration fee.

Concurrent sessions are 1-hour presentations of select abstracts.

Paper sessions include four 15-minute presentations of scientific research and quality improvement projects from select abstracts.

Case sessions include four 15-minute case-based presentations from select abstracts.

Educational forums are 1-hour sessions by faculty invited by AAHPM or HPNA to present on a critical topic area.

Early-riser sessions are concurrent sessions offered early in the morning.

Poster sessions are two 1-hour visual presentations of scientific research, quality improvement projects, and case-based and scholars work-in-progress content. (CE credit is available for posters, excluding scholar e-posters.)

Interactive Educational Exchange is a 90-minute session that provides a structured, interactive, and hands-on experience.
