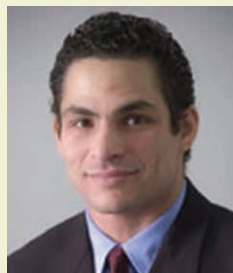

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The ASGE Annual Postgraduate Course will focus on the evolving trends in endoscopic oncology highlighting the importance of multidisciplinary and personalized care of patients with GI cancer and how to integrate that into your practice. Topics to be covered will include the diagnosis, management, treatment and surveillance options for patients with cancerous or precancerous conditions in an era of precision medicine. Video-based case discussions with a multi-disciplinary panel of experts will be utilized to illustrate clinical challenges.
