Dr. Gerald B. Appel

is Director of Clinical Nephrology at Columbia University Medical Center at The New York-Presbyterian Hospital, New York, New

York, and is a tenured Professor of Clinical Medicine at Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. He is Chief of the Glomerular Kidney Disease Center at Columbia U. He received his undergraduate BA from Cornell University graduating in three years with distinction in all subjects and as a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He received his medical degree from Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Bronx, New York, in 1972., where he was elected to the medical honor society Alpha Omega Alpha. He completed his internship and residency in Internal Medicine at Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center. He then completed fellowships in Nephrology at both Columbia-Presbyterian (1975-1976) and at Yale-New Haven Medical Center, New Haven, Connecticut (1976-1978).

Dr Appel has been listed in New York Magazine as one of the “Best Doctors in New York” annually between 1992 and 2010, and is listed in “Best Doctors in America,” and also in “How to Find the Best Doctors in N.Y. Metro Area.” He is an associate editor of Clinical JASN and of Up-To-Date. Dr. Appel is a member of numerous societies and has served on the Medical Advisory Board and as the Chairman of the Research Committee of the National Kidney Foundation of New York and New Jersey and The Kidney and Urology Foundation of America, as a past president of the New York Society of Nephrology, and as Chair of the Council of Glomerulonephritis of the National Kidney Foundation of the US. He is the director of many courses including The Columbia U Internal Medicine Course in NYC, Renal Biopsy in Medical Diseases of the Kidney in NYC, and The Treatment of Glomerular Diseases at the annual American Society of Nephrology meetings. Dr. Appel has authored and co-authored almost 300 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters.



Robert Blaser has served as RPA’s Director of Public Policy since October 2003, and previously as RPA’s Director of Federal Affairs since September 1997. From

June 1995 to September 1997, Rob served as RPA’s Regulatory Analyst. Among Rob’s primary areas of responsibility since joining RPA are management of RPA’s legislative and regulatory portfolios, and policy development for the organization. In this latter role Rob has taken the lead in drafting over 30 position papers for RPA. Rob has also developed expertise in

such diverse areas as legislative developments affecting renal care, physician reimbursement in the Medicare Fee Schedule (MFS), and other issues pertaining to CKD-specific coverage and reimbursement issues.

Prior to joining RPA, Rob served as Director of Subspecialty Representation for the American College of Physicians (ACP), providing government affairs services for organizations representing rheumatologists, clinical endocrinologists, and general internists, among other specialties. He also previously had a decade of experience in the private insurance industry.

Dr. Richard Glassock

is an internationally recognized expert in the field of Glomerular Diseases and Clinical Nephrology.

He has published over 550 original papers, books, book chapters and reviews. He is the past-president of the American Society of Nephrology and the National Kidney Foundation and past-Chairman of the American Board of Internal Medicine. He is a member of the American Association of Physicians and in 1999 was elected to Mastership in the American College of Physicians. He is the former Chair of the Departments of Medicine at the University of Kentucky (1992-1999) and Harbor-UCLA Medical Center (1980-1992). From 1967 to 1980 he was also the Chief of Nephrology at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. He was continuously funded by the NIH from 1967 to 1992 for his research in renal immuno-pathology.

He has lectured in over 95 countries throughout the world, been a visiting professor at over 100 academic institutions and has trained over 50 Nephrologists,

many of whom have gone on to distinguished academic posts throughout the world. He is an honorary member of many International Nephrology Societies.

Doctor Glassock has received many awards including the David Hume Memorial Award of the National Kidney Foundation, The Robert Narins Award of the American Society of Nephrology, the Distinguished Achievement Awards of both the UCLA School of Medicine and the Association of Professors of Medicine and the Torchbearer Award of the American Kidney Fund. He is the founding Editor-in-Chief of the NephSAP Journal of the American Society of Nephrology. He retired from Academic administration in 1999 and is currently Professor Emeritus at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA and an independent medical consultant.

He married to Jo-Anne and lives in Laguna Niguel, California. He has four children (Ellen, Scott, Sharon and Mark), seven grandchildren and one great-grandchild. His hobbies are golf, travel, fine wine, and history.



Dr. Glen Markowitz

received his undergraduate degree from Brandeis University in 1990 and his MD from Albert Einstein College of Medicine in 1994. After

three years of residency in anatomic pathology at Albert Einstein College of Medicine, he spent a year as the Renal Pathology Fellow at Columbia University in 1997-8, training under Dr. Vivette D'Agati. He subsequently joined the faculty at Columbia University, College of Physicians & Surgeons in

1998 and has remained on the faculty since that time, achieving the rank of Professor of Pathology & Clinical Pathology in 2008 and assuming the role of Vice Chairman for Operations in 2011. During 2015 he served a 1-year term as the President of the Renal Pathology Society, the largest organized body of Renal Pathologists in the world with a current membership that exceeds 550. Dr. Markowitz's areas of academic interest include toxic forms of renal injury, dysproteinemic renal disease, and membranous glomerulopathy. He has published more than 160 articles and many additional chapters.

Dr. Marc A. Pohl is currently Head of the Section of Clinical Hypertension and Nephrology, Department of Nephrology and Hypertension at the Cleveland Clinic

Foundation, and holds the Ray W. Gifford, Jr., M.D. Endowed Chair in Hypertension.

After graduating from Amherst College, Dr. Pohl received his medical degree from Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine, and then interned and completed a residency at University Hospitals of Cleveland, followed by a senior residency and nephrology fellowships at Massachusetts General Hospital, Boston University Medical Center and Boston City Hospital. Dr. Pohl has been affiliated

with the Cleveland Clinic Foundation since 1973; his appointments have included heading the home dialysis training program, and serving as program director of the Department of Nephrology and Hypertension.

Dr. Pohl has been a co-investigator in several major trials, including the Collaborative Study of Adult Nephrotic Syndrome and Adult Glomerular Disease, the Lupus Nephritis Collaborative Study Group, the North American Adult Nephrotic Syndrome, and the Collaborative Study Group. He is the author of more than 80 articles, 90 abstracts, and numerous book chapters. Dr. Pohl actively participates as a faculty member of many national and international symposia and postgraduate courses in nephrology and hypertension.



Dr. Michael V. Rocco is a professor of nephrology at Wake Forest Baptist and chairs the National Kidney Foundation's Kidney Disease Outcomes Quality Initiative

(KDOQI), where he has expanded the scope of the organization from guideline development to include the topics of research, public policy and educational components. "Our goal is to improve the morbidity, mortality and quality of life of patients with chronic kidney disease," said Rocco.

Rocco has served as the clinical center principal investigator at Wake Forest Baptist for several NIH trials, including the HEMO Study, the Acute Renal Failure Trial Network (ATN), the Dialysis Access

Consortium (DAC) and the Frequent Hemodialysis Network (FHN). In the HEMO Study, he served as the chair of the Nutrition Committee and the vice-chair of the Outcomes Committee. In the FHN Trial, he is the Clinical Core Consortium PI for the Nocturnal Trial and the chair of the Outcomes Committee.

Rocco has been instrumental in the NIH-sponsored Frequent Hemodialysis Network (FHN) Consortium, a randomized clinical trial of standard 3-times-weekly hemodialysis with 6 nights per week home hemodialysis. The study investigated the effectiveness of higher frequency and duration of hemodialysis on a number of outcomes including heart size, quality of life, blood pressure, anemia and other complications of dialysis therapy.

Dr. Matthew R. Weir

is attending physician and Director of the Division of Nephrology in the Department of Medicine at the University of Maryland Hospital,

Baltimore. He is also Professor of Medicine at the University of Maryland School Of Medicine.

Dr. Weir's primary research interests include the use of antihypertensive therapy for the treatment of diabetic nephropathy, hypertensive renal injury in African Americans, blood pressure salt sensitivity, biomeasures of cardiovascular disease, and preventing allograft nephropathy in transplant recipients. He has written more than 500 manuscripts and book chapters about these topics. He has edited five books including "Medical Management of Kidney Transplantation" and "Hypertension". He has presented at numerous international scientific association meetings, hospitals, and medical schools.

Dr. Weir currently reviews manuscripts for more than 30 major medical journals, including the

American Journal of Kidney Disease, the Journal of the American Society of Nephrology, and Archives of Internal Medicine. He is on the editorial board of 15 journals and is Section Editor of Current Hypertension Reports and Current Opinion in Hypertension and Nephrology and Associate Editor of the American Journal of Nephrology and Clinical Nephrology. He is supported by two NIH grants from NIDDK and investigator-initiated grants from industry. In addition, he is a member of numerous associations, including the American Society of Nephrology, the National Kidney Foundation, the American Heart Association, and the American Society of Transplantation.

Dr. Weir received his medical degree from the University of Virginia, Charlottesville. He completed his internship and residency programs in medicine at the Waterbury and Yale-New Haven Hospitals in Connecticut, and completed his nephrology training at the Brigham and Women's Hospital, Harvard Medical School, in Boston, Massachusetts. He then moved to the University of Maryland where he has been a full time faculty member since 1983.
