Target Audience: This course designed for 1) physicians practicing: pediatric oncology; adult medical oncology; family medicine; primary care; and specialties (e.g., cardiology, fertility) that routinely treat adolescents and young adults; 2) clinical and laboratory researchers; 3) AYA cancer patients and survivors, and 4) patient advocates.

Activity Goal: This activity will examine the current successes, persistent and new challenges, and the outlook for Adolescent and Young Adult (AYA) oncology. Our distinguished speakers will address critical topics in AYA oncology from the perspective of their own clinical and research areas of expertise.

Learner Objectives: *At the conclusion of the activity, learners will be able to:*

- Identify and apply evidence-based guidelines and clinical pathways for the care, treatment, and long-term monitoring of cancer patients and cancer survivors between the ages 15 and 39 (i.e., adolescent and young adults (AYAs)).
- Delineate how to enhance the quality of life of AYA cancer patients and cancer survivors by addressing symptoms, functional sequelae, and psychosocial morbidity.
- Collaborate with colleagues to conduct inter-disciplinary research in AYA oncology.
- Implement new models-of-care for AYA cancer patients and survivors, the elements of which include multidisciplinary AYA teams, psychosocial care, survivorship planning, clinical trial enrollment, and age-appropriate facilities for treatment and consultation.
- Identify unmet needs facing AYA cancer patients and survivors, develop the appropriate responses to address these needs, and evaluate the effectiveness of those responses.
