IMPLANT AND RESTORATIVE DENTISTRY IN THE DIGITAL

Digital Dentistry is the new hot topic and has erupted within the dental office and maybe even more so in the Dental Laboratory industry. While it is nothing new to implant dentistry, every phase of restorative dentistry has been transformed by technology and it will continue to expand in the future. The impressions we make do not use impression material, lost wax crown fabrication is being eliminated and physical models are becoming a thing of the past. Our discussion will initially focus on digital dentistry and how it is transforming implant dentistry and then lead into the future trends and the effect it may have upon your dental practice.

The course objectives are to familiarize participants with:

- Utilization of CAD/CAM (3d software), scanners and 3d printers for prosthodontic procedures
- Ideal implant positioning and indications for hard/soft tissue grafting.
- Surgical considerations with the computer-generated guides

MICHAEL E. RAZZOOG

Dr. Razzoog received his DDS, MS and MPH all from the University of Michigan and is currently a Professor in the Department of Prosthodontics. He has served numerous committees for organized dentistry, governmental organizations, and specialty groups within the profession. Within the University he has served on the Institute of Gerontology task force and acted as the interim director of continuing education and is presently the director of graduate prosthodontics. Dr. Razzoog has served as member or chair of 73 Master of Science thesis committees in Prosthodontics, Operative Dentistry and Orthodontics. He has authored over 100 journal articles and book chapters in areas of emerging technologies for prosthodontic care and has served as an editor for the *International Workshop: Biocompatibility, Toxicity and Hypersensitivity to Alloy Systems Used in Dentistry, Black Dentistry in the 21st Century* and *Quality Assurance and Cost Containment of Dental Health Care*. In recent years his research interest is with the prosthetic aspects of dental implant usage and ceramic CAD/CAM technologies.

Course Title: Stoners, Dragon Chasers, Tweakers and Drunks - Not in my practice....Yeah right!

Brett Kessler, DDS has been practicing esthetic, functional and reconstructive dentistry since 1995. He has been published in *5280 magazine*, *Doctor of Dentistry Magazine*, *Catalyst Magazine*, *Self Magazine*, *More Magazine*, *Women's World Magazine* and the New York fashion magazine, *Lucireon* various subjects with respect to cosmetic dentistry and wellbeing issues. Dr. Kessler has also been featured on local 9News (NBC), Fox News and News 4 (CBS) and CNN regarding his charitable contributions to the Denver community. In 2015, Dr. Kessler was featured by the Denver Post as the only dentist in Colorado with its inaugural "Strength in Health" award. He has been recognized by his peers as a "Top Dentist" in *5280 Magazine* every year since its inception in 2005.

Dr. Kessler is a past president of the Colorado Dental Association. He also serves as the chairman of the Wellbeing Committee for the State of Colorado and is a consultant for the American Dental Association, serving for several years on the Dental Well Being Advisory Committee. Brett currently serves as Vice-Chair on ADA's Council on Dental Benefit Plans. Brett was selected by the 14th ADA District as its representative to the ADA's Board of Trustees.

He is a Fellow in the American College of Dentists, International College of Dentists and the Pierre Fauchard Academy.

In the fall of 2007, Dr. Kessler testified on behalf of the American Dental Association before congress on the ravages of methamphetamines on the oral health. He speaks internationally to various organizations and dental societies with a focus on wellbeing and leadership concepts.

While in private practice, he was a clinical associate professor at the University of Michigan until he moved to Colorado in 1999. Brett then taught occlusion and morphology at the University of Colorado, School of Dental Medicine from 2003-2011.

Brett keeps in shape by both coaching and participating in various endurance races across the United States including the Ironman World Championships in Kona, HI.
