PROGRAM DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

After two tremendously successful courses in 2018 and 2019, we are excited to present again the only course of its kind in the New York metropolitan area, and one of a select few in the world. Our courses have sold out to maximum capacity in past years. This fun and exciting hands-on course will introduce cutting-edge surgical techniques and the latest advances in patient care, including transcanal endoscopic ear surgery, transnasal Eustachian tube surgery (including balloon dilation), and advances in endoscopic sinus surgery, skull base surgery, and endoscopic orbital surgery.
